 CONSERVATION) (NO. 10) ORDER, 2002.**

This Order provides for a management regime for the monkfish fishery in Area VII with effect from the 1st day of July, 2002.

From that date, an Irish sea-fishing boat equal to or greater than 55 feet in length, or a person on board such boat, may not have on board or land more than 4 tonnes of monkfish during the period from the 1st day of July to the 31st day of July, 2002. All other Irish sea-fishing boats fishing for monkfish or a person on board such boat may not have on board or land more than 2 tonnes of monkfish during this period.

It is prohibited to tranship or to engage in transhipment operations of monkfish.

**COD (FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AND  
 CONSERVATION) (NO. 6) ORDER, 2002.**

This Order provides for a management regime for the cod fishery in Area VII (excl VIIa) with effect from the 1st day of July, 2002.

From that date, an Irish sea-fishing boat equal to or greater than 55 feet in length, or a person on board such boat, may not have on board or land more than 1 tonne of cod during the period from the 1st day of July to the 31st day of July, 2002. All other Irish sea-fishing boats fishing for cod or a person on board such boat may not have on board or land more than 0.75 tonnes of cod during this period.

It is prohibited to tranship or to engage in transhipment operations of cod.

COMMON SOLE (FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AND  
CNOSERVATION) (NO. 3) ORDER, 2002.

This Order introduces a new management regime for landings and transshipments of common sole caught by Irish sea fishing boats in ICES Divisions VIIIf and VIIg with effect from the 1st day of July, 2002.

The Order allows Irish sea-fishing boats to land or tranship common sole caught in ICES Divisions VIIIf and VIIg provided that

boats fishing by means of beam trawls - the common sole may not exceed 0.2% by weight of the total catch of quota species landed or transhipped on any occasion.

boats fishing by means other than beam trawls — the common sole may not exceed 0.2% by weight of the total catch of all quota species landed or transhipped on any occasion.

All other Irish sea-fishing boats fishing for monkfish or a person on board such boat may not have on board or land more than 4 tonnes of monkfish during this period.

It is prohibited to tranship or to engage in transhipment operations of monkfish.
