ELECTRICITY REGULATION ACT, 1999 (PUBLIC SERVICE OBLIGATIONS) ORDER, 2002.

The Minister for Public Enterprise, Mrs. Mary O'Rourke, has made an Order under section 39 of the Electricity Regulation Act, 1999 (No. 23 of 1999), (as amended), entitled the Electricity Regulation Act, 1999 (Public Service Obligations) Order, 2002 (S.I. No. 217 of 2002).

The Electricity Regulation Act, 1999 (Public Service Obligations) Order, 2002 (PSO Order) directs the Commission for Energy Regulation to impose public service obligations on ESB which will require ESB to purchase, up until 31 December 2019, the output of certain peat and renewable/alternative electricity generating stations in the interests of security of supply and environmental protection respectively. The PSO Order provides for the introduction of a PSO levy on final electricity customers, from 1 January, 2003, to compensate ESB for the additional costs incurred in complying with these public service obligations. The cost of these sources of electricity is already embedded in ESB's franchise tariff and therefore, on introduction of the PSO levy, an appropriate adjustment will be made to separately identify the PSO levy on electricity bills, on a basis approved by the Commission for Energy Regulation.

EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES (ENVIRONMENTAL

Notice of the consent by the Minister of State at the Department of Public Enterprise for the application of Bord Gáis Éireann to construct a Mayo-Galway natural gas transmission pipeline in accordance with section 8 of the Gas Act, 1976 as amended.

Whereas Bord Gáis Éireann has made an application under Section 8(7) of the Gas Act, 1976 to the Minister of State at the Department of Public Enterprise (“the Minister”) for consent to construct a pipeline for the transmission of natural gas which pipeline is to be known as the Mayo-Galway Gas Pipeline. The proposed gas pipeline is 149 km in length, 650 mm in diameter and will follow a route close to or through the following places: Bellanaboy Bridge, Bellacorick, Crossmolina, Castlebar and Claremorris, all in the County Mayo and Tuam, Athenry and Cruaghwell, all in the County Galway.

And Whereas Bord Gáis Éireann in compliance with the above Act and Regulations has submitted an Environmental Impact Statement to the Minister in support of its application aforesaid.

And Whereas the Minister has concluded that (subject to the conditions referred to at (1) below) such statement adequately addressed all environmental aspects in accordance with Irish and European legislation.

And Whereas the Minister has decided that (subject to performance of the said conditions) the proposed development would not be likely to have significant long-term effects on the environment.

And Whereas the Minister has concluded that the proposed pipeline development is necessary to:

- facilitate the delivery of Corrib Gas to the marketplace via the proposed Gas Pipeline to the West and the existing Bord Gáis transmission network.
- increase security of supply aspects of the gas transmission system.

TAKE NOTICE that the Minister has, on 4th March, 2002, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Section 8(7) of the Gas Act, 1976, given his consent for the construction of a Mayo-Galway natural gas transmission pipeline. The consent is subject to:

- (1) conditions regarding protection of the environment required by the Department of Arts, Heritage, Gaeltacht and the Islands.
- (2) other conditions, notified by the Minister to Bord Gáis Éireann.
