The Minister for the Marine and Natural Resources, Mr. Frank Fahey, T.D., has made the following orders:

S.I. No. 148 of 2002.

BLUE WHITING (FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION) ORDER, 2002.

This Order prohibits fishing for, transshipment, landing or having on board blue whiting by Irish sea-fishing boats in ICES Division, I, II, V (EC waters), VI, VII, XII and XIV with effect from midnight on the 18th April, 2002.

S.I. No. 156 of 2002.

HERRING (FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION) ORDER, 2002.

This Order prohibits fishing for, transshipping, landing or having on board herring by Irish sea-fishing boats in ICES Divisions Vb, VIaS, VIaN, VIb, VIIbc with effect from 4 p.m. on the 23rd April, 2002. This order allows for a 5% by-catch of herring.

The Minister for the Marine and Natural Resources, Mr. Frank Fahey, T.D., has made the following orders:

S.I. No. 167 of 2002.

COD (FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION) (No. 4) ORDER, 2002.

This Order provides for a management regime for the cod fishery in area VII (excl VIIa) with effect from the 1st day of May, 2002. From that date, an Irish sea-fishing boat equal to or greater than 55 feet in length, or a person on board such boat, may not have on board or land more than 1 tonne of cod during the period of the 1st day of May, 2002 and the 31st day of May, 2002. All other Irish sea-fishing boats fishing for cod or a person on board such boat may not have on board or land more than 0.75 tonnes of cod during this period. It is prohibited to tranship or to engage in transshipment operations of cod.

MONK (FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION) (No. 5) ORDER, 2002.

This Order provides for a management regime for the monkfish fishery in Area Vb (EC waters), VI, XII, XIV with effect from the 1st day of May, 2002. From that date, an Irish sea-fishing boat equal to or greater than 55 feet in length, or a person on board such boat, may not have on board or land more than 6 tonnes of monkfish during the period from the 1st day of May to the 31st day of May, 2002. All other Irish sea-fishing boats fishing for monkfish or a person on board such boat may not have on board or land more than 3 tonnes of monkfish during this period. It is prohibited to tranship or to engage in transshipment operations of monkfish.

MONK (FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION) (No. 6) ORDER, 2002.

This Order provides for a management regime for the monkfish fishery in Area VII with effect from the 1st day of May, 2002. From that date, an Irish sea-fishing boat equal to or greater than 55 feet in length, or a person on board such boat, may not have on board or land more than 4 tonnes of monkfish during the period from the 1st day of May to the 30th day of May, 2002. All other Irish sea-fishing boats fishing for monkfish or a person on board such boat may not have on board or land more than 2 tonnes of monkfish during this period. It is prohibited to tranship or to engage in transshipment operations of monkfish. (Pn. 11527) (Price: €0.76).

S.I. No. 170 of 2002.

MACKEREL (FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION) ORDER, 2002.

This Order prohibits with effect from 27th April 2002, fishing for, transhipment or having on board mackerel by Irish sea-fishing boats of length greater than or equal to 55 feet in ICES sub-areas and divisions IIa, IVa, Vb, VI, VII, VIIIa, b, d, e, XII and XIV. This fishery has been closed with effect from 27th April, 2002, subject to allowance for a 5% by-catch provision. (Pn. 11528) (Price: €0.76)

S.I. No. 171 of 2002.

WHITING (FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION) (No. 4) ORDER, 2002.

This Order provides for a management regime for the whiting fishery in Area VII with effect from the 1st day of May, 2002. From that date, an Irish sea-fishing boat equal to or greater than 55 feet in length and fishing by means of Scottish fly seines or a person on board such boat, may not have or retain on board more than the following quantities of whiting during the period from the 1st day of May to the 31st day of May, 2002.

(a) 35 tonnes of whiting in sub-area VII (ex VIIa)

(b) 2 tonnes of whiting in sub-area VIIa.

subject to the condition that not more than a maximum of 35 tonnes of whiting shall be retained on board or landed in Area VII as a whole. All other Irish sea-fishing boats fishing for whiting or a person on board such boat, may not have on board or land more than the following quantities of whiting during this period:

(a) 25 tonnes of whiting in sub-area VII (ex-VIIa)

(b) 1 tonne of whiting in sub-area VIIa

subject to the conditions that not more than a maximum of 25 tonnes of whiting shall be landed or retained on board in Area VII as a whole. It is prohibited to tranship or to engage in transshipment operations of whiting.

HAKE (FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION) ORDER (No. 3), 2002.

This Order provides for a continuation of the management regime for the hake fishery in Area VI, VII with effect from the 1st day of May, 2002. From that date, an Irish sea-fishing boat equal to or greater than 55 feet in length and fishing by means of longlines or Scottish fly seines, or a person on board such boat, may not have on board or land more than 2 tonnes of hake during the period from the 1st day of May, 2002 to the 31st day of May, 2002. All other Irish sea-fishing boats fishing for hake by any other method regardless of length, or a person on board such boat, may not have on board or land more than 1 tonne of hake during this period. It is prohibited to tranship or to engage in transshipment operations of hake. (Pn. 11530) (Price: €0.76)

2. The day on which the ballot papers are to be issued and posted to electors in university constituencies shall be the 12th day of June, 2002.
3. The day and hour at which the poll in university constituencies shall be closed shall be the 17th day of July, 2002, at 11.00 a.m.
4. This Order may be cited as the Seanad (University Members) General Election Order, 2002.

SEANAD (PANEL MEMBERS) GENERAL ELECTION
ORDER, 2002

WHEREAS on 25th day of April 2002, the President, on the advice of the Taoiseach, dissolved Dáil Éireann:

AND WHEREAS a general election for Seanad Éireann is required by section 8 of Article 18 of the Constitution to take place not later than ninety days after the said dissolution:

NOW THEREFORE the Minister for the Environment and Local Government in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 24 of the Seanad Electoral (Panel Members) Act, 1947, by this his Order appoints for the purpose of the said election as follows:

1. The period during which the Seanad Returning Officer may receive proposals for nominations to the panels by nominating bodies shall expire at noon on the 7th day of June, 2002.
2. The period during which the Seanad Returning Officer may receive nominations to the panels by members of the Oireachtas shall expire at noon on the 14th day of June, 2002.
3. The 20th day of June, 2002 shall be the day on which the Seanad Returning Officer will sit for the completion of the panels and the place at which she will sit for the said purpose shall be Leinster House, Dublin 2.
4. The day on which the ballot papers shall be issued shall be the 2nd day of July, 2002.
5. The poll shall be closed at 11.00 a.m. on the 16th day of July, 2002.
6. The address of the Seanad Returning Officer to which nomination papers and other communications may be sent shall be Leinster House, Dublin 2.
7. This Order may be cited as the Seanad (Panel Members) General Election Order, 2002.

Made under the Road Traffic Act, 1994 by Limerick City Council.

Limerick City Council, the Road Authority for the City of Limerick, in exercise of the powers in that behalf them enabling under Section 36 of the Road Traffic Act, 1994 hereby make the following bye-laws in respect of the area comprising the City of Limerick.

- Short title.
1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Limerick City (Parking Places) (Amendment) Bye-Laws, 2002.
- Commencement of bye-laws.
2. These bye-laws shall come into operation on the 1st day of August, 2002.
- Increase of fee for Parking discs.
3. Bye-Law 12 of the Limerick County Borough (Parking Places) Bye-Laws, 1998, as amended by Bye-Law 3 of the Limerick County Borough (Parking Places) (Amendment) Bye-Laws, 2000, is hereby amended by the substitution of “€1” for “50p” and the said Bye-Law as so amended is set out in the Table to this bye-law.
12. The fee for a parking disc shall be €1.
