THE WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY (MOBILE RADIO SYSTEMS) REGULATIONS, 2002.

The Director of Telecommunications Regulation has made a Statutory Instrument, under the Wireless Telegraphy Act, 1926, S.I. No. 435 of 2002. These Regulations provide for the issuing of licences for types of mobile radio systems intended for local or on-site use, not covered by existing regulations. Subject to spectrum availability, they will allow licensing of a variety of mobile radio systems including, Public Access Trunked Radio systems, Automatic Vehicle Location systems and Mobile Data systems.
