However, nothing shall prevent any any payment in good faith by the Company of:

- (i) reasonable and proper remuneration of any member, officer or servant of the Company (not being a Director) for any services rendered to the Company;
- (ii) Interest at a rate not exceeding 5% per annum on money lent by Directors or other members of the Company to the Company;

- (iii) Reasonable and proper rent for premises demised and let by any member of the Company (including any Director) to the Company;
- (iv) Reasonable and proper out of pocket expenses incurred by any Director in connection with attendance to any matter affecting the Company;
- (v) Fees, remuneration or other benefit in money’s worth to any Company of which a Director may be a member holding not more than one hundredth part of the Issued Capital of such Company.
