S.I. No. 56 of 2003.

WHITING (FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION) (No. 3) ORDER, 2003.

This Order provides for a management regime for the whiting fishery in Area VIIa with effect from the 1st day of March, 2003. From that date, an Irish sea-fishing boat equal to or greater than 55 feet in length and fishing by means of Scottish fly seines or a person on board such boat, may not have or retain on board or land more than the following quantities of whiting during the period from the 1st day of March to the 31st day of March, 2003. 2 tonnes of whiting in sub-area VIIa. All other Irish sea-fishing boats fishing for whiting or a person on board such boat may not have or retain on board or land more than the following quantities of whiting during this period: 1 tonne of whiting in sub-area VIIa. It is prohibited to tranship or to engage in transhipment operations of whiting. (Pn. 12850) (Price: €0.76).

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S.I. No. 55 of 2003.

COD (FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION) (No. 4) ORDER, 2003.

This Order provides for a management regime for the cod fishery in area VIIa with effect from the 1st day of March, 2003. From that date, an Irish sea-fishing boat equal to or greater than 55 feet in length, or a person on board such boat, may not have or retain on board or land more than 8 tonnes of cod during the period of the 1st day of March, 2003 and the 31st day of March, 2003. All other Irish sea-fishing boats fishing for cod or a person on board such boat may not have or retain on board or land more than 4 tonnes of cod during this period. It is prohibited to tranship or to engage in transhipment operations of cod. (Pn. 12849) (Price: €0.76).

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S.I. No. 54 of 2003.

COD (FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION) (No. 3) ORDER, 2003.

This Order provides for a management regime for the cod fishery in area VII (excl. VIIa) with effect from the 1st day of March, 2003. From that date, an Irish sea-fishing boat equal to or greater than 55 feet in length, or a person on board such boat, may not have or retain on board or land more than 1 tonne of cod during the period of the 1st day of March, 2003 and the 31st day of March, 2003. All other Irish sea-fishing boats fishing for cod or a person on board such boat may not have or retain on board or land more than 0.75 tonne of cod during this period. It is prohibited to tranship or to engage in transhipment operations of cod. (Pn. 12848) (Price: €0.76).

S.I. No. 57 of 2003.

HADDOCK (FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION) (No. 2) ORDER, 2003.

This Order provides for a management regime for the haddock fishery in Area VII with effect from the 1st day of March, 2003. From that date, an Irish sea-fishing boat equal to or greater than 55 feet in length and fishing by means of Scottish fly seines or a person on board such boat, may not have or retain on board or land more than the following quantities of haddock during the period from the 1st day of March to the 31st day of March, 2003. (a) 3 tonnes of haddock in sub-area VII (ex VIIa), (b) 2 tonnes of haddock in sub-area VIIa subject to the condition that not more than a maximum of 3 tonnes of haddock shall be retained on board or landed in Area VII as a whole. All other Irish sea-fishing boats fishing for haddock or a person on board such boat, may not have or retain on board or land more than the following quantities of haddock during this period: (a) 1.5 tonne of haddock in sub-area VII (ex VIIa), (b) 1 tonne of haddock in sub-area VIIa subject to the conditions that not more than a maximum of 1.5 tonnes of haddock shall be landed or retained on board in Area VII as a whole. It is prohibited to tranship or to engage in transhipment operations of haddock. (Pn. 12851) (Price: €0.76).

EASTERN FISHERIES REGION (RIVER SLANEY)
(ANGLING)

BYE-LAW No. C.S. 278, 2003

I, John Browne, Minister of State at the Department of Communications, Marine and Natural Resources, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 9 (as amended by section 3 of the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1962 (No. 31 of 1962)) of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act 1959 (No. 14 of 1959), section 33 of the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1962, the Fisheries (Transfer of Departmental Administration and Ministerial Functions) Order 1977 (S.I. No. 30 of 1977) (as adapted by the Marine (Alteration of Name of Department and Title of Minister) Order 2002 (S.I. No. 307 of 2002)) and the Communications, Marine and Natural Resources (Delegation of Ministerial Functions) Order 2002 (S.I. No. 374 of 2002), hereby make the following Bye-law:

1. This Bye-law may be cited as the Eastern Fisheries Region (River Slaney) (Angling) Bye-law No. C.S. 278, 2003.
2. This Bye-law shall come into operation on 26 February, 2003.
3. Angling for salmon or trout with rod and line is hereby prohibited in the River Slaney and its tributaries during the period commencing 26 February, 2003 and ending 9 March, 2003.
4. In this Bye-law, "salmon" and "trout" shall have the meanings assigned to them by section 3 of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act 1959 (No. 14 of 1959), as amended.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This note is not part of the Bye-law and does not purport to be a legal interpretation).

This Bye-law provides that the annual close season for angling for salmon and trout in the River Slaney and its tributaries shall be extended from 26 February, 2003 to 9 March, 2003 both dates inclusive.

FOOTNOTE

Section 11 of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act, 1959 provides that any person aggrieved by this Bye-law may within 28 days after its publication in the Iris Oifigiúil, appeal against the same to the High Court.

NOTICE OF POLICY DIRECTIONS TO THE COMMISSION FOR COMMUNICATIONS REGULATION

Mr. Dermot Ahern T.D., Minister for Communications, Marine and Natural Resources, has, on 21 February 2003, in accordance with s.13 of the Communications Regulation Act 2002 (No. 20 of 2002) given policy directions to the Commission for Communications Regulation. Details of the directions and the reasons for giving them are set out in this notice.

1. POLICY DIRECTION ON COMMUNICATION OBJECTIVES

“In carrying out its functions, the Commission shall have regard to

- the Programme for Government 2002, including the provision of the Programme set out in the section “Building Peace and Justice” stating:

“We will improve North-South infrastructural links and facilitate cross-border planning”, and the objectives set out in the section “Developing the Regions and the Islands” as well as the provisions relating to electronic communications set out in the section “Research, Development and Innovation”, and

- the objectives for the communications sector specified in the Statement of Strategy of the Department of Communications, Marine and Natural Resources, when published.”

Reason for Policy Direction

The purpose of this policy direction is to facilitate coherence among the various elements of public policy relevant to the communications sector. Government policy for the communications sector is reflected in the Programme for Government and in the Department’s Statements of Strategy. While the Commission is independent in the performance of its functions, the regulatory framework for the communications sector is an element of public policy and the Minister believes that the regulatory framework should play its part in contributing to the achievement of these overall objectives for the sector.

2. POLICY DIRECTION ON ACCESS TO THE INTERNET AT FLAT RATE CHARGES

“The widespread availability of dial-up access to the internet charged at flat rates and at affordable prices would be of substantial benefit to users as well as for the further development of the market for internet access provision. In the first instance, the development and provision of such access services are matters for market players. The Commission shall make use of its powers under the legislation as appropriate, to bring about agreements among market players in order to facilitate early introduction of retail dial-up internet access services charged at flat rates. The Commission shall report to the Minister on progress in relation to this matter within one month of the issue of this direction, and on a monthly basis thereafter until such time as retail services are introduced, making any recommendations it considers appropriate for further action.”

Reason for Policy Direction

The Minister believes that widespread availability of dial-up access to the internet charged at flat rates and at affordable prices will stimulate the development demand for and supply of

information society services. The purpose of this policy direction is to ensure that the Commission makes use of its powers as appropriate to facilitate the early introduction of retail flat rate internet access services.

3. POLICY DIRECTION ON BROADBAND ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION NETWORKS

“The Commission shall, in the exercise of its functions, take into account the national objective regarding broadband rollout, viz, the Government wishes to ensure the widespread availability of open-access, affordable, always on broadband infrastructure and services for businesses and citizens on a balanced regional basis within three years, on the basis of utilisation of a range of existing and emerging technologies and broadband speeds appropriate to specific categories of service and customers.”

Reason for Policy Direction

The purpose of this policy direction is to ensure that the regulatory framework for electronic communications plays its part in contributing to the achievement of the Government’s objectives regarding the rollout of broadband networks.

4. POLICY DIRECTION ON INDUSTRY SUSTAINABILITY

“The Commission shall ensure that in making regulatory decisions in relation to the electronic communications market, it takes account of the state of the industry and in particular the industry’s position in the business cycle and the impact of such decisions on the sustainability of the business of undertakings affected.”

Reason for Policy Direction

The Minister considers that the communications sector is an economic driver for the Irish economy, and in particular Ireland’s future knowledge-based economic and social progress. The purpose of this policy direction is to ensure that regulatory decisions take due account of the sustainability of the industry in a situation where the business cycle is having a substantial impact on such sustainability and in particular on the prospects for further investment in and development of the sector.

5. POLICY DIRECTION ON REGULATION ONLY WHERE NECESSARY

“Where the Commission has discretion as to whether to impose regulatory obligations, it shall, before deciding to impose such regulatory obligations on undertakings in the market for electronic communications, examine whether the objectives of such regulatory obligations would be better achieved by forbearance from imposition of such obligations and reliance instead on market forces.”

“Where the Commission has discretion as to whether to impose regulatory obligations, it shall, before deciding to impose such regulatory obligations for the purpose of the management of the radio frequency spectrum, examine whether the objectives of such regulatory obligations would be better achieved by forbearance from imposition of such obligations and reliance instead on market forces.”

Reason for Policy Direction

It is the Minister’s view that market freedom can have a positive impact on the further development of the sector in terms of innovation, competition, customer choice and quality of service. Accordingly, regulatory obligations should only be imposed where they achieve these targets more effectively than reliance on market forces.

6 POLICY DIRECTION ON REGULATORY IMPACT ASSESSMENT

“The Commission, before deciding to impose regulatory obligations on undertakings in the market for electronic communications or for the purposes of the management and use of the radio frequency spectrum or for the purposes of the regulation of the postal sector, shall conduct a Regulatory Impact Assessment in accordance with European and International best practice and otherwise in accordance with measures that may be adopted under the Government’s Better Regulation programme.”

Reason for Policy Direction

The purpose of this policy direction is to ensure that the objectives and effects of regulatory obligations are given due consideration before a decision is taken to impose such obligations.

7. POLICY DIRECTION ON CONSISTENCY WITH OTHER MEMBER STATES

“The Commission shall ensure that, where market circumstances are equivalent, the regulatory obligations imposed on undertakings in the electronic communications market in Ireland should be equivalent to those imposed on undertakings in equivalent positions in other Member States of the European Community.”

Reason for Policy Direction

The purpose of this policy direction is to ensure, where circumstances are equivalent, a consistent approach with other Member States, in relation to the imposition of regulatory obligations on undertakings, so that Ireland will not be at a competitive disadvantage relevant to other EU Member States by virtue of a more diverse or onerous regulatory regime.

8. POLICY DIRECTION ON COST OF REGULATION

“The Commission shall ensure that the costs incurred by it in effectively carrying out its functions in relation to the electronic communications market and the management of the radio frequency spectrum are minimised, consistent with best practice in other Member States of the European Community, and, subject to any different conditions that may exist, should not be out of line with the cost of regulation in such Member States.”

“The Commission shall ensure that the costs incurred by it in effectively carrying out its functions in relation to the postal market are minimised, consistent with best practice in other Member States of the European Community, and, subject to any different conditions that may exist, should not be out of line with the cost of regulation in such Member States.”

Reason for Policy Direction

The purpose of this policy direction is to ensure that the Commission operates at a minimal cost to the economy and that the cost of regulation in Ireland is not inconsistent with the cost of regulation in other Member States, in the interests of national competitiveness.

9. POLICY DIRECTION ON CONSISTENCY ACROSS PLATFORMS

“The Commission shall ensure that regulatory obligations imposed upon undertakings engaged in the provision of similar electronic communications services but using different technologies are consistent, taking into account any different conditions that may exist, including the existence of market power.”

Reason for Policy Direction

This policy direction is aimed at ensuring that appropriate regulatory consistency is maintained where similar services delivered under different technologies, in the interests of promoting competition and consumer choice.

10. POLICY DIRECTION ON REGULATION OF PRICES

“The Commission shall ensure that, taking into account the requirement regarding the affordability of prices of electronic communications services that come within the universal service obligation, as defined in the Directive of the European Parliament and Council of 7 March 2002 on universal service and users rights relating to electronic communications networks and services (O.J. No. L 108, 24.4.2002), the provisions of a price cap under section 7 of the Telecommunications (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1996 (No. 34 of 1996) are set in such a way that they do not inhibit the development of viable competition in the market for the services coming within the scope of any such price cap and take into account their impact on further investment in the sector by the industry, including investment in infrastructural development.”

Reason for Policy Direction

The purpose of this policy direction is to ensure that the Commission, in exercising its powers in relation to retail price control, takes due account of the impact of price control measures on the prospects for viable competition and further investment in the sector.

11. POLICY DIRECTION ON MANAGEMENT OF THE RADIO FREQUENCY SPECTRUM

“The Commission shall ensure that, in its management of the radio frequency spectrum, it takes account of the interests of all users of the radio frequency spectrum.”

Reason for Policy Direction

The purpose of this policy direction is to ensure that the Commission achieves an appropriate balance between the interests of various users of the radio frequency spectrum, in particular, the respective interests of commercial and non-commercial users.

12. POLICY DIRECTION ON UNIVERSAL POSTAL SERVICE

“The Commission shall ensure that, in exercising its functions in relation to the postal universal service obligation, it considers the impact of the exercise of such functions on the cost of sustaining the universal service, which cost includes per employee costs arising from national pay policy.”

Reason for Policy Direction

The purpose of this policy direction is to ensure that the Commission considers the cost to the universal service provider of sustaining the universal service. Such costs include pay increases arising from national pay policy.
