ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT
REQUEST FOR EXEMPTION

Notice is hereby given by An Bord Pleanála (the Board) in accordance with section 172 (3)(d) of the Planning and Development Act 2000 that the Board received a request for exemption from a requirement of the planning authority to prepare an environmental impact statement (EIS).

Location: The former Minch Norton Premises at Barrack Street and Island Street, Enniscorthy, County Wexford.

Development: Demolition of existing grain silos and erection of a mixed commercial and residential development which includes the conversion, change of use and alterations of an existing listed mill building (reference number CDPL45).

Planning Authority: Enniscorthy Town Council, Market Square, Enniscorthy, County Wexford.

Planning Authority Register Reference No.: T.P. 1445.

Planning Authority Decision: To request an EIS.

Applicant: A1 Uisce Developments Limited.

An Bord Pleanála Decision: To grant the request for exemption.

An Bord Pleanála Reference No.: 59.EA.2001.

Reasons and Considerations for Decision:

The Board considered that, for the purposes of deciding on the applicant's request under section 172, exceptional circumstances apply, having regard to—

- (a) the relatively small size of the proposed development (as also its nature and location) and, in particular,
- (b) the grant of planning permission (under planning register reference number T.P. 1442) by the planning authority — subsequent to its decision to require an environmental impact statement in this case — for a larger development on the greater portion of the applicant's adjacent lands.

The Board also decided that, having regard to the information already submitted to the planning authority, the effects of the development on the environment could be adequately assessed on the basis of the information submitted in the context of the planning application and that no other special requirement need apply.
