EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES (RECREATIONAL CRAFT)
(AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 2004.

The Minister for Communications, Marine and Natural Resources, Mr. Dermot Ahern, T.D., has made the above Regulations. These Regulations transpose Council Directive 2003/44/EC amending Directive 94/25/EC on the approximation of the laws, regulations and administrative provisions of the Member States relating to recreational craft. These Regulations apply to all recreational craft and partly completed boats from 2.5 to 24 metres hull length as well as to personal watercraft and to certain components. The main purpose of the amendment is to include harmonised provisions on exhaust gas and noise emissions from engines. In order to meet the essential safety requirements in the Directive, recreational craft, partly completed boats, personal watercraft and certain components must be manufactured in conformity with specified European harmonised standards, which are being set following assessment of the national standards of Member States.

These Regulations (other than Regulation 9(b) of these Regulations) come into operation on 1 January 2005. Regulation 9(b) comes into operation on the making of this regulation, this provision increases the fine amount from £1500 to €3000 for a person found guilty of an offence under these Regulations.

EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES (ENERGY LABELLING OF HOUSEHOLD ELECTRIC REFRIGERATORS AND FREEZERS) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 2004.

The purpose of the Regulations is to give legal effect to Commission Directive 2003/66/EC of 3 July 2003 which amends Commission Directive 94/2/EC of 21 January 1994 and Council Directive 92/75/EEC of 22 September 1992 in so far as it relates to household electric refrigerators, freezers and their combinations.

The effect of Directive 2003/66/EC is to divide the existing energy efficiency rating category of A on energy labels required to be affixed to household refrigeration appliances displayed for sale, into 3 new categories (A, A+ and A++).

These Regulations which amend the EC (Energy Labelling of Household Electric Refrigerators and Freezers) Regulations 1995 (S.I. 122 of 1995 — the "Principal Regulations") come into operation on 20 July 2004 and apply to electric mains operated household refrigerators, frozen food storage cabinets, food freezers and their combinations. Appliances that may also use other energy sources such as batteries, used appliances and appliances of which production has ceased before 30 June 2004 are excluded.

Where a person offers an appliance for sale by way of a communication (as defined in Regulation 3 of the Principal Regulations as amended), that person is required by Regulation 6 of the Principal Regulations as amended to provide essential information to the potential purchaser as set out in Schedule 3. The maximum penalty for a summary offence is being increased from £1,500 to €3,000 in line with current maxima of summary offences.

EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES (ORGANISATION OF WORKING TIME) (ACTIVITIES OF DOCTORS IN TRAINING) REGULATIONS 2004.

(This note is not part of the Instrument and does not purport to be a legal interpretation of the Instrument).

These Regulations implement those provision of Directive 2003/34/EC² of the European Parliament and of the Council which bring the activities of doctors in training within the scope of Council Directive 93/104/EC¹ concerning certain aspects of the orgainsation of working time.

These Regulations prescribe maximum hours of work and minimum hours of rest for those persons engaged in the activities of doctors in training. Between 1 August 2004 and 31 July 2007, an employer cannot require a person engaged in the activities of doctors in training to work for more than 58 hours a week, averaged over a maximum 12 month reference period. Between 1 August 2007 and 31 July 2009, an employer cannot require such a person to work for more than 56 hours a week, averaged over a maximum 6 month period. A 48-hour average working week is due to be introduced from August 2009.

These Regulations require employers to keep records of each employee's hours of work, rest and such other records in the form prescribed by Regulation 11 of these Regulations.

These Regulations amend certain provisions of the Organisation of Working Time Act 1997 (the "**1997 Act**") to apply them to the activities of doctors in training. In particular, the powers of inspectors under section 8 of the 1997 Act are extended to cover the activities of doctors in training. A person engaged in the activities of doctors in training may present a complaint to a Rights Commissioner, under Part IV of the 1997 Act, that his or her employer has contravened a relevant provision of these Regulations. Similarly, the provisions of the 1997 Act which provide for appeals from and enforcement of the recommendations of Rights Commissioners are applied to presons engaged in the activities of doctors in training.

These Regulations amend the Safety, Health and Welfare at Work (Night Work and Shift Work) Regulations 2000 (S.I. No. 11 of 2000) (the "**2000 Regulations**") to apply them to the activities of doctors in training. The 2000 Regulations give effect to the safety and health protection provisions of Article 9 of Directive 93/104/EC².
