LIMERICK COUNTY COUNCIL
COMHAIRLE CHONTAE LUIMNIGH

PRESENTATION AND COLLECTION OF HOUSEHOLD
AND COMMERCIAL WASTE, BYE-LAWS, 2004

Whereas Limerick County Council has by virtue of Section 35 of the Waste Management Acts, 1996 to 2003 and by virtue of part VII of the Local Government Act, 1994 and in exercise of every other power in that behalf enabling and in particular by reference to Section 35 (1)(b) of the Waste Management Acts, 1996 to 2003 power to make bye-laws requiring a holder of waste to present such waste for collection by a person collecting waste in accordance with Part IV of the Waste Management Acts, 1996 to 2003 and further in particular by reference to Section 35(1)(b) of the Waste Management Acts, 1996 to 2003 power to make by-laws requiring holder of household or commercial waste who presents such waste for collection as aforesaid (whether pursuant to a requirement of bye-laws under Section 35(1)(a) of the Waste Management Acts, 1996 to 2003 or not) to so present the waste in a manner specified in the bye-laws and whereas Limerick County Council considers that for the purpose of the proper management of waste or the prevention or control of environmental pollution it is necessary to make these bye-laws.

NOW BE IT KNOWN THAT Limerick County Council hereby make the following bye-laws

Short Title

(1) These Bye-Laws may be cited as the Limerick County Council (Presentation and Collection of Household Waste and Commercial Waste), Bye-Laws, 2004.

Commencement of Bye-Laws

(2) The Bye-Laws shall come into operation on the 1st July 2004.

Area of Application

(3) The Bye-Laws apply to the area comprising the functional area of Limerick County Council.

Interpretation

(4) The interpretation of the definitions as set out in the Waste Management Acts, 1996 to 2003 is applied to these Bye-Laws, save where otherwise specified.

Throughout these Bye-Laws, the following words and expressions shall have the meanings hereinafter respectively assigned to them, unless the context otherwise requires:—

“authorised person” means an “authorised person” within the meaning of Section 40(10) of the Local Government Act, 1994 as amended by Section 35 of the Litter Pollution Acts, 1997 to 2003 and comprises an authorised person for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1994 (Bye-Laws) Regulations [S.I. No. 360 of 1995] or any Act or Regulation extending or amending the same.

“footpath”, “footway”, “public road” and “roadway” have the meaning assigned to them by Section 2(1) of the Roads Act, 1993.

[3]

“person” shall mean—

- (a) In the case of household dwellings, the person shall be the occupier.
- (b) In the case of all other premises it shall be the person in charge.

“service provider” shall mean a person other than Limerick County Council who, for the purpose of reward, with a view to profit or otherwise in the course of business, collects waste, as the case may be, under a Waste Collection Permit granted by the Limerick County Council under the Waste Management (Collection Permit) Regulations, 2001 and subsequent amendments thereof which is for the time being in force.

“service” shall mean the service of the collection of waste by a service provider.

“the prescribed time” means on such days and such hours of the day as may be fixed from time to time by a service provider for the collection of household waste or commercial waste, as the case may be, from any premises by such service provider.

“the prescribed place” means in relation to any premises—

- (a) a convenient place immediately outside the entrance to any premises or on the kerbstone or outer edge of the footpath or footway immediately in front of any premises or
- (b) in the absence of a footpath, on the roadway immediately in front of any premises but not in a position so as to cause an obstruction or safety risk to users of such roadway or
- (c) in relation to a particular premises outside or on such premises in such conveniently accessible position as the service provider shall from time to time agree with the occupier of any premises or
- (d) in areas of restricted vehicular access, at the entrance to the roadway.
- (e) At any location other than those referred to at (a), (b), (c) & (d) above, subject to the approval of the Limerick County Council.

“wheeled-bin” means a receptacle which complies with the standards for mobile waste containers specified in I/S EN 840-1; 1997 (Parts 1 — 6 inclusive) and which is used for the purposes of presenting household waste or commercial waste for collection and shall be deemed to include a reference to any microchip provided, if fitted or retrofitted at any time.

“plastic bags”, means clear bio-degradable plastic bags for the presentation of “dry recyclable” materials only.

“microchip” includes any electronic device capable of being implanted in or attached in any way to a wheeled bin and which is used for the purposes of recording, storing, sorting, calculating, migrating and/or using data of a business or technical nature concerning use of the wheeled-bin in which it is implanted or to which it is attached.

Obligation to present Household Waste or Commercial Waste in a wheeled-bin

(5) Subject to Bye-Law No. 7 and No. 9 of these Bye-Laws a person shall, at the prescribed time and in the prescribed place, present household waste or commercial waste, as the case may be, for collection, [by the service provider providing the service of the collection of waste to such occupier] wholly contained within a wheeled-bin.

Obligation to present Household or commercial Waste in a wheeled-bin holding a valid label

(6) Wheeled-bins presented for collection shall have a valid label attached identifying the person who presented the wheeled-bin for collection.

Segregated Waste Collection

(7) A person presenting household waste or commercial waste for collection shall not place or cause to be placed or put in a wheeled-bin any waste for which a separate segregated collection is provided by the service provider.

Where a separate segregated collection is provided by the service provider, the person presenting waste for collection shall place the appropriate waste in the wheeled-bin, or alternative receptacle as approved by Limerick County Council, which is labelled to identify the type of separate collection (e.g. dry recyclable collection, collection of organic material).

Where commercial cardboard is being presented for collection, the person presenting the cardboard shall ensure that cardboard is bound in a manner approved by the service provider.

Obligation to present household waste or commercial waste in a wheeled-bin which is not damaged

(8) A person presenting household waste or commercial waste for collection shall not present or cause to be presented any such waste in a wheeled-bin in circumstances where the wheels or lid of such wheeled-bin have been removed or damaged or in circumstances where such wheeled-bin has been damaged to such an extent that it is not fit for the purpose for which it was designed or is not capable of being conveniently emptied.

Prohibition on presenting waste for collection other than in a wheeled-bin

(9) A person presenting household waste or commercial waste for collection shall not present for collection any household waste or commercial waste in:—

- (a) plastic refuse sacks or bags of any sort unless such plastic refuse sacks or bags are contained fully within a wheeled-bin provided by the service provider, unless otherwise approved by Limerick County Council.
- (b) any type of refuse bin, receptacle or container other than in a wheeled-bin provided by the service provider, unless otherwise approved by Limerick County Council.
- (c) boxes or other packaging, unless otherwise approved by Limerick County Council.

where prepaid refuse bags are used, the bags shall be placed in a wheeled bin provided by the service provider from whom the prepaid bags have been purchased. The wheeled bin shall have

a label indicating that the bin is for prepaid bag use only. This label shall contain the name and address of the responsible person.

Manner in which wheeled-bin requires to be presented

(10) A person presenting household waste or commercial waste for collection shall present the wheeled-bin with the lid thereof fully closed and where possible, with the handles of the wheeled-bin pointed in the direction of the public road.

Prohibition on person presenting waste for collection by a person who is not a service provider

(11) A person presenting household waste or commercial waste for collection shall not present such waste for collection by any person other than a service provider.

Times for presentation of waste for collection and removal of wheeled-bin after collection

(12) A person presenting household waste or commercial waste for collection should not present the same for collection earlier than 6.00 pm on the day prior to collection and such person shall not cause or permit such wheeled-bin to remain outside any premises after the day of collection.

Wheeled-bin deemed to have been placed for the collection of waste therein

(13) Where any wheeled-bin is or remains in the prescribed place during the prescribed time, it shall be deemed to have been placed in the prescribed place by a person with the intention that it be presented for collection of the household waste or commercial waste therein.

Prohibition on depositing waste on any footway, pavement or roadway unless it is in a wheeled-bin

(14) The occupier of any premises who shall remove or cause to be removed, any household waste or commercial waste, as the case may be, produced upon his premises, shall not in the process of removal deposit such household waste or commercial waste upon any footway, footpath, pavement or roadway, nor shall he allow the same to be deposited upon any such footway, footpath, pavement or roadway, by any person acting directly for him provided that the foregoing requirements shall not be deemed to prohibit the deposition in the prescribed place of any wheeled-bin (or other receptacle approved by Limerick County Council) containing household waste or commercial waste, as the case may be, for collection in pursuance of and in accordance with Bye-Law No. 5, No. 7 and No. 9 of these Bye-Laws.

Offences and Penalty

(15) A person who contravenes a provision of these bye-laws shall be guilty of an offence under and by virtue of Section 40 of the Local Government Act, 1994 and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding €1,250.

Fixed Payment Notice

(16) (1) If an authorised person has reasonable grounds for believing that a person is committing a contravention or has committed a contravention of a provision of these Bye-Laws, the authorised person may serve on the person a fixed payment notice as prescribed by the Local Government Act, 1994 (Bye-Laws) Regulations, 1995 [S.I. No. 360 of 1995] or any Regulation amending or extending the same stating:—

- (a) that the person is alleged to have committed the contravention,
- (b) that the person may during the period of 21 days beginning on the date of the notice, make to the County Council a fixed payment in the sum of €60 accompanied by the Notice, and
- (c) that a prosecution in respect of the alleged contravention will not be instituted during the period specified in the notice and, if the payment specified in the notice is made during that period, no prosecution in respect of the alleged offence will be instituted.

(2) Where a notice is issued under sub-section (1):—

- (a) a person to whom the notice applies may, during the period specified in the notice, make to Limerick County Council the payment specified in the notice, accompanied by the notice,
- (b) Limerick County Council shall receive the payment and issue a receipt for it.
- (c) a prosecution in respect of the alleged contravention shall not be instituted in the period specified in the notice and, if the payment specified in the notice is made during that period, no prosecution in respect of the alleged contravention shall be instituted.

(3) In a prosecution for a contravention referred to in subsection (1), the onus of showing that a payment pursuant to a notice under this section has been made shall lie with the person on whom the notice is served.

(4) Any notice required to be served by or under this Bye-Law shall be served in accordance with Section 16 of the Waste Management Acts, 1996 to 2003.
