POLICY DIRECTIVE 2/2004

The Minister for Communications, Marine and Natural Resources, Mr. Dermot Ahern, T.D., has issued the following Policy Directive:

Policy Directive 2/2004

This Policy Directive provides that only fishing vessels which are entered on the Sea Fishing Boat Register and which hold an operative fishing boat licence are legally entitled to fish. Sea Fishing Boat Licences granted by the Licensing Authority in respect of fishing boats shall thus not be valid for the purpose of fishing until the boat is entered onto the Sea Fishing Boat Register. This is to ensure compliance with the legal framework of the Common Fisheries Policy. The Directive shall enter into force on 21 September 2004.
