S.I. No. 171 of 2004.

RACECOURSE (AUTHORISED BOOKMAKERS PITCH CHARGES) REGULATION 2004.

It is proposed, following consultations between the Association of Irish Racecourses, the Irish National Bookmakers Association and Horse Racing Ireland, that a pitch charge would be introduced for on-course bookmakers.

This charge, as provided for in Section 54B of the Irish Horseracing Industry Act 1994 (as inserted by the Horse and Greyhound Racing (Betting Charges and Levies) Act 1999), would then be paid by all bookmakers holding pitches at an authorised racecourse.

It is proposed that the charges would be collected by Horse Racing Ireland in conjunction with the turnover charge monthly direct debit system already in operation.

The payments would be returned by Horse Racing Ireland to the relevant racecourse.

AUTHORISED BOOKMAKERS (COURSE BETS TURNOVER CHARGE) REGULATION 2004.

It is proposed, following consultations between the Irish National Bookmakers Association and Horse Racing Ireland, that the existing turnover charge of 0.3% payable by on-course bookmakers in respect of all bets placed with an authorised bookmaker, other than in a betting shop and placed solely on a horse race taking place at the authorised racecourse at which the bet is placed, as provided for by section 54A (2), (a) of the Act (as inserted by the Horse and Greyhound Racing (Betting Charges and Levies) Act 1999) be increased to 0.5%.

THOROUGHBRED FOAL LEVY (AMENDMENT)
REGULATION 2004.

Neither the Foal Levy nomination fee ranges nor rates payable have been changed since the introduction of the Thoroughbred Foal Levy Scheme in 2000.

The conversion of the nomination fee ranges and rates payable to their euro equivalent occurred automatically in 2002.

It is now considered appropriate, for ease of reference and operation, to re-classify the nomination fee ranges and amend the rates payable. The resultant changes to the rates payable represents an inflationary increase of 5% on the rates set out in the Thoroughbred Foal Levy Regulations 2000.

The amendments also provide that all thoroughbred foals born in Ireland requiring registration must be registered in Ireland.

Horse Racing Ireland, the Statutory Body responsible for the horse racing industry, have made the above Regulations under Section 54B, Section 54A and Section 38A of the Irish Horseracing Industry Act 1994 (as amended by the Horse and Greyhound Racing (Betting Charges and Levies) Act 1999).

EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES (MECHANICALLY
PROPELLED VEHICLE ENTRY INTO SERVICE)
(AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 2004.

These regulations amend the existing Mechanically Propelled Vehicle Entry into Service Regulations 2003 which set out the requirements to be met by new vehicles other than cars (i.e., commercial vehicles and buses) entering into service by giving effect to two additional directives, Directive 2003/102/EC (pedestrian protection) and Directive 97/39/EC (Speedometers). Directive 97/39/EC will facilitate the proposed introduction of the metrification of speed limits and will apply to new vehicles entering service with effect from 1 January 2005. The Directive also requires vehicles to be equipped with a device for reversing which can be operated from the driving position.
