## TO WHOM IT CONCERNS

## CHANGE OF SPEED LIMIT AT M11 LOUGHLINSTOWN

Notice is hereby given that Dun Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council in exercise of the powers conferred on it by the Road Traffic Act 1961-1994, Road Traffic (Special Speed Limit) Regulations, 1994 and the Local Government Act 1994 has introduced a temporary Speed Limit Bye-Law of 40 m.p.h. in respect of its administrative area on a section of the M11, to facilitate works to connect the M50 with the existing M11 Shankill By-Pass. The speed limit will apply to both carriageways and extend from a point 200 metres south of the off-ramp to Old Connaught Avenue northwards to the commencement of the existing 30 m.p.h. speed limit at Loughlinstown Roundabout.

The introduction of this 40 m.p.h. speed limit commenced with effect from 11th May, 2004.
