VEHICLE TESTING:  
CHANGE IN THE FREQUENCY OF  
ROADWORTHINESS TESTING FOR LIGHT GOODS  
VEHICLES.

The Minister for Transport has made Regulations entitled "European Communities (Vehicle Testing) (Amendment) Regulations 2004". The Regulations provide that Light Goods Vehicles will be liable to a roadworthiness test when 1 year old and every year thereafter. The duration of validity of certificates of roadworthiness issued in respect of roadworthiness tests will be 1 year. This will standardise the test periods for all commercial vehicles.

- If your vehicle was registered before 1 September 2000 there is no change in the date on which it is liable for a test (i.e. the first test due date is the 4th anniversary of registration).
- If your vehicle was registered between 1 September 2000 and 31 August 2003 it is liable for a test on 1 September 2004.
- If your vehicle was registered on or after 1 September 2003 it is liable for a test when it becomes 1 year old (i.e. on the anniversary of registration).
