BLUE LING (FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION) (NO. 3) ORDER 2004.

Prn. 3626

This Order introduces a new management regime for landings and transshipments of Blue Ling caught by Irish sea fishing boats in ICES Divisions VI and VII with effect from 7 October 2004. The Order allows Irish sea-fishing boats to land or tranship Blue Ling caught in ICES Divisions VI and VII provided that the Blue Ling may not exceed 5% by weight of the total catch of quota species landed or transhipped on any occasion. S.I. No.'s 484 of 2004 and 556 of 2004 are revoked.

HORSE MACKEREL (FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION) REGULATIONS 2004.

Prn. 3627

The effect of these Regulations is to prohibit fishing for, transhipment or having on board horse mackerel by Irish sea-fishing boats in ICES sub-areas Vb, VI, VII, VIIIa,b,d,e, XII and XIV with effect from 7 October 2004.

TO WHOM IT CONCERNS

The Revenue Commissioners hereby give notice pursuant to Section 142 of the Finance Act 2001 that on 15th day of October 2003, one Nissan Sunny motor vehicle, bearing identification mark SXI 1378 was seized by Officers of the Revenue Commissioners under Section 141(1) of the Finance Act 2001 on the grounds that it was liable to forfeiture under Section 139(6) of the Finance Act 1992.

Your attention is drawn to the Provisions of Section 143 of the Finance Act 2001 which states as follows:

(2) A notice under sub-section (1) shall specify the name and address of the claimant and, in the case of a claimant who is outside the State, the name and address of a Solicitor in the State who is authorised to accept service of any document required to be served on the claimant and to act on behalf of the claimant.
