The Minister for Communications, Marine and Natural Resources, Mr. Dermot Ahern, T.D., has made the following Orders:

S.I. No. 427 of 2002.

**MONK (FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION) (No. 13) ORDER 2002.**

This Order provides for a management regime for the monkfish fishery in Area VII with effect from the 1st day of September, 2002. From that date, an Irish sea-fishing boat equal to or greater than 55 feet in length, or a person on board such boat, may not have on board or land more than 5 tonnes of monkfish during the period from the 1st day of September to the 30th day of September, 2002. All other Irish sea-fishing boats fishing for monkfish or a person on board such boat may not have on board or land more than 2.5 tonnes of monkfish during this period.

It is prohibited to tranship or to engage in transshipment operations of monkfish.

**MONK (FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION) (No. 14) ORDER 2002.**

This Order provides for a management regime for the monkfish fishery in Area Vb (EC waters), VI, XII, XIV with effect from the 1st day of September, 2002. From that date, an Irish sea-fishing boat equal to or greater than 55 feet in length, or a person on board such boat, may not have on board or land more than 10 tonnes of monkfish during the period from the 1st day of September to the 30th day of September, 2002. All other Irish sea-fishing boats fishing for monkfish or a person on board such boat may not have on board or land more than 5 tonnes of monkfish during this period.

It is prohibited to tranship or to engage in transshipment operations of monkfish.

**COD (FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION) (No. 8) ORDER 2002.**

This Order provides for a management regime for the cod fishery in Area VII (excl. VIIa) with effect from the 1st day of September, 2002. From that date, an Irish sea-fishing boat equal to or greater than 55 feet in length, or a person on board such boat, may not have on board or land more than 0.5 tonne of cod during the period of the 1st day of September 2002 and the 30th day of September 2002. All other Irish sea-fishing boats fishing for cod or a person on board such boat may not have on board or land more than 0.25 tonne of cod during this period.

It is prohibited to tranship or to engage in transhipment operations of cod.

**COMMON SOLE (FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION) (No. 4) ORDER 2002.**

This Order provides for a revised management regime in the Sole VIIa — Irish Sea fishery with effect from the 1st day of August 2002. The Order allows Irish sea-fishing boats to land or tranship common sole caught in the Irish Sea provided that:

boats fishing by means of beam trawls — the common sole does not exceed 40% by weight of the total catch of quota species landed or transhipped on any occasion.

boats fishing by means other than beam trawls — the common sole does not exceed 10% by weight of the total catch of all quota species landed or transhipped on any occasion.

**COMMON SOLE (FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION) (No. 5) ORDER 2002.**

This Order provides for a new management regime for landings and transhipments of common sole caught by Irish sea fishing boats in ICES Divisions VII $f$  and VII $g$  with effect from the 1st September 2002. The Order allows Irish sea-fishing boats to land or tranship common sole caught in ICES Divisions VII $f$  and VII $g$  provided that:

boats fishing by means of beam trawls — the common sole does not exceed 0.1% by weight of the total catch of quota species landed or transhipped on any occasion.

boats fishing by means other than beam trawls — the common sole does not exceed 0.1% by weight of the total catch of all quota species landed or transhipped on any occasion.
