## NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF THE LIMERICK CITY COUNCIL (PRESENTATION AND COLLECTION OF HOUSEHOLD WASTE AND COMMERCIAL WASTE) BYE-LAWS, 2005

NOTICE is hereby given by Limerick City Council having offices at City Hall, Limerick, the local authority for the city of Limerick, having considered that for the purpose of the proper management of waste or the prevention or control of environmental pollution, it is necessary so to do, and, in exercise of the powers vested in it by section 35 of the Waste Management Act, 1996 and in exercise of every other power in that behalf it enabling, to make The Limerick City Council (Presentation and Collection of Household Waste and Commercial Waste), Bye-Laws, 2005. These bye-laws have undergone the statutory public consultation period, and following submissions have subsequently been adopted by the City Council at its meeting on the 29th March, 2005.

The Limerick City Council (Presentation and Collection of Household Waste and Commercial Waste) Bye-Laws 2005 shall come into operation on the 1st May, 2005.

The adopted bye-laws make provision therein requiring the holder of household waste/commercial waste to present such waste for collection by a person collecting waste on foot of a Waste Collection Permit granted under Part IV of the Waste Management Act, 1996, as amended, and requiring a holder of household waste or commercial waste who presents such waste for collection to do so present the waste in the manner specified in the adopted Bye-Laws and the adopted Bye-Laws, in particular contain an obligation therein:—

- (i) Requiring the occupier of any premises to present household (other than dry recyclable waste and organic waste) and commercial waste (other than dry recyclable waste and organic waste), as the case may be, for collection (by the service provider providing the service of the collection of waste to such occupier) wholly contained within a wheeled-bin and requiring such occupier to comply with whatsoever directions are given to him or her or given generally by public notice or otherwise, by such service provider as to identification marks or other marks, badges, labels, tags, discs or other things to be attached or affixed to or displayed upon the wheeled-bin provided always that notwithstanding the foregoing the occupier of any premises may present household waste (other than dry recyclable or organic waste) for collection wholly contained within a plastic bag provided to such occupier provided that Limerick City Council has given its prior written consent to such occupier authorising the doing of same and such occupier shall comply with whatsoever directions are given to him or her or given generally by public notice or otherwise, by such service provider providing to such occupier the service as to identification marks or other marks, badges, labels, tags, discs or other things upon such plastic bags.
- (ii) Requiring the occupier of any premises to present dry recyclable waste (being that part of household waste or commercial waste comprising waste which can be

recovered, recycled, or reprocessed such as aluminium cans, papers, bottles, or cardboard) or organic waste (being that part of household waste or commercial waste comprising green waste such as vegetable waste from gardens, grounds or parks, tree cuttings, branches, grass, leaves, sawdust, wood, wood chips and any other wood waste not treated with heavy metals or organic compounds) for collection (by the service provider providing the service of the collection of such waste to such occupier) in accordance with whatsoever directions in that regard are given to him or her, or given generally by public notice or otherwise by such service provider as to the manner in which dry recyclable waste or organic waste requires to be presented for collection (be such waste required to be presented wholly contained within a wheeled-bin, or wholly contained within a container, bag or other type of receptacle for which such container, bag or other type of container the service provider has obtained the prior written approval thereof from Limerick City Council) and in accordance with whatsoever directions are given by the service provider to such occupier or given generally by public notice or otherwise as to the identification marks or other marks, badges, labels, tags, discs or other things to be attached or affixed to or displayed upon such wheeled-bin, or container, bag or other type of receptacle, as the case may be provided and such occupier shall comply with all and any such directions Provided Always that where cardboard is being presented by a person for collection by a service provider such person shall bind same in a manner approved by Limerick City Council,

- (iii) Requiring a person presenting waste in a wheeled-bin for the collection to have affixed thereto an identification mark, badge, label, tag, disc or other thing provided by the service provider to such person in circumstances where the date indicated on such identification mark, badge, label, tag, disc or other thing has not expired by effluxion of time,
- (iv) Requiring a person, other than a service provider not to remove, damage, destroy, tamper with, render inoperative or otherwise interfere with a microchip implanted or in any way attached to a wheeled bin nor shall the person remove, damage, destroy, tamper with, render inoperative or otherwise interfere with an identification mark, badge, label, tag or disc or other thing attached to or affixed to or displayed upon a wheeled bin containing waste for collection by a service provider,
- (v) Prohibiting a person from placing matter in a wheeled-bin matter likely to cause damage thereto,
- (vi) Prohibiting a person from presenting waste for collection by a service provider earlier than 8.00 pm on the day immediately preceding the day fixed for the collection thereof and prohibiting a person from causing or permitting a wheeled-bin to remain outside any premises after the end of the day upon which the waste is collected.

The bye-laws contain a further provision therein to the effect that such bye-laws shall apply to the area comprising the city of Limerick and further contain provision therein with regard to authorised persons in the enforcement of the bye-laws.

The bye-laws also contain a provision therein to the effect that a person who contravenes a provision of the bye-laws shall be guilty of an offence under and by virtue of section 40 of the Local Government Act, 1994 and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding €1,500.00.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that:—

- (i) A copy of the bye-laws is available for public inspection free of charge at the Environment, Recreation and Sport Department, City Hall, Limerick during normal office hours,
- (ii) A copy of the bye-laws can be bought on payment of a fee of €2.50,
- (iii) Details of the bye-laws are also available on the Limerick City Council website [www.limerickcity.ie](http://www.limerickcity.ie) The bye-laws can be found under the Environment Department Section, sub category Waste Management/Waste Regulations Information.
