These Regulations amend the European Communities (Additives Colours and Sweeteners in Foodstuffs) Regulations 2000 (S.I. No. 437 of 2000) in the manner specified in these Regulations.

These Regulations may be cited as the European Communities (Additives Colours and Sweeteners in Foodstuffs) (Amendment) Regulations 2005 (S.I. No. 61 of 2005).

EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES (NUTRITION LABELLING

These Regulations concern nutrition labelling of foodstuffs for the ultimate consumer and for mass caterers. They revoke the Health (Nutrition Labelling for Foodstuffs) Regulations 1993 (S.I. No. 388 of 1993).

These Regulations give further effect to Council Directive 90/496/EEC of 24 September 1990 on nutrition labelling for foodstuffs [previously transposed by the Health (Nutrition Labelling for Foodstuffs) Regulations 1993 (S.I. No. 388 of 1993)]. They also give effect to Commission Directive 2003/120/EC of 5 December 2003, amending Directive 90/496/EEC by the addition of an energy value conversion factor for salatrims.

These Regulations may be cited as the European Communities (Nutrition Labelling for Foodstuffs) Regulations 2005.

These Regulations concern foodstuffs intended for particular nutritional uses. They revoke the European Communities (Foodstuffs Intended for Particular Nutritional Uses) Regulations 2002 (S.I. No. 379 of 2002) and the European Communities (Foodstuffs Intended for Particular Nutritional Uses) (Amendment) Regulations 2002 (S.I. No. 441 of 2002) and bring into effect new Regulations.

These Regulations give further effect to Council Directive 89/398/EEC of 3 May 1989 on the approximation of the laws of the Member States relating to foodstuffs intended for particular nutritional uses, as amended by Directive 96/84/EC₂ of the European Parliament and of the Council of 19 December 1996, and Directive 1999/41/EC₃ of the European Parliament and of the Council of 7 June 1999, and give further effect to Commission Directive 2001/15/EC₄ of 15 February 2001 [previously transposed by the European Communities (Foodstuffs Intended for Particular Nutritional Uses) Regulations 2002 (S.I. No. 379 of 2002) and the European Communities (Foodstuffs Intended for Particular Nutritional Uses) (Amendment) Regulations 2002 (S.I. No. 441 of 2002)].

These Regulations also give effect to Commission Directive 2004/5/EC₅ of 20 January 2004 amending Directive 2001/15/EC₄ to include certain substances in the Annex, and Commission Directive 2004/6/EC₆ of 20 January 2004 derogating from Directive 2001/15/EC₄ to postpone the application of the prohibition of trade to certain products.

These Regulations give effect to Commission Directive 98/53/EC₂ of 16 July 1998 laying down the sampling methods and the methods of analysis for the official control of the levels for certain contaminants in foodstuffs, as amended by Commission Directive 2002/27/EC₃ of 13 March 2002 and Commission Directive 2003/121/EC₄ of 15 December 2003, and Commission Directive 2001/22/EC₅ of 8 March 2001 laying down the sampling methods and the methods of analysis for the official control of the levels of lead, cadmium, mercury and 3-MCPD in foodstuffs, and Commission Directive 2002/26/EC₆ of 13 March 2002 laying down the sampling methods and methods of analysis for the official control of the levels of ochratoxin A in foodstuffs, Commission Directive 2002/69/EC₇ of 30 July 2002 laying down the sampling methods and the methods of analysis for the official control of dioxins and the determination of dioxin-like PCBs in foodstuffs, Commission Directive 2003/78/EC₈ of 11 August 2003 laying down the sampling methods and the methods of analysis for the official control of the levels of patulin in foodstuffs and Commission Directive 2004/16/EC of 12 February 2004 laying down the sampling methods and the methods of analysis for the official control of the levels of tin in canned foods.

The principal effect of these Regulations is to provide for the methods of sampling and for the sample preparation and methods of analysis for the official control of the levels of certain contaminants in foodstuffs in accordance with the methods described in the Annexes of the Directives.

I, Pat the Cope Gallagher, Minister of State at the Department of Communications, Marine and Natural Resources, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 9 (as amended by section 3 of the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1962 (No. 31 of 1962)) of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act 1959 (No. 14 of 1959), section 33 of the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1962, the Fisheries (Transfer of Departmental Administration and Ministerial Functions) Order 1977 (S.I. No. 30 of 1977) (as adapted by the Marine and Natural Resources (Alteration of Name of Department and Title of Minister) Order 2002 (S.I. No. 307 of 2002)) and the Marine (Delegation of Ministerial Functions) (No. 2) Order 2004 (S.I. No. 703 of 2004), hereby make the following Bye-law:

1. This Bye-Law may be cited as the Eastern Fisheries Region (River Slaney) (Angling) Bye-law No. C.S. 282, 2005.
2. This Bye-Law shall come into operation on 26 February, 2005.
3. Angling for salmon or trout with rod and line is hereby prohibited in the River Slaney and its tributaries during the period commencing 26 February 2005, and ending 9 March, 2005.
4. In this Bye-law, "salmon" and "trout" shall have the meanings assigned to them by section 3 of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act, 1959 (No. 14 of 1959) as amended.
