They also give legal effect to Article 25.5 which designates the Regulatory Authority as a dispute settlement authority in certain cases.

MARKET ABUSE (DIRECTIVE 2003/6/EC) REGULATIONS 2005.

Mr. Micheál Martin, Minister for Enterprise, Trade and Employment, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 30 of the Investment Funds, Companies and Miscellaneous Provisions Act 2005, has made Regulations entitled as above. The Regulations give effect to Directive 2003/6/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council of 28 January 2003 on insider dealing and market manipulation (Market Abuse) and detailed implementing Directives 2004/72/EC, 2003/124/EC, 2003/125/EC.

These Regulations apply to any financial instrument admitted to trading on a regulated market and create a new offence of market manipulation. They seek to promote the integrity of Europe's financial markets by introducing a common EU legal framework for preventing, detecting, investigating and sanctioning both insider dealing and market manipulation. They also provide a common framework for the disclosure of information to the market and replace the existing insider dealing legislation contained in Part V of the Companies Act 1990 (although repealed for purposes of regulated stock market dealings, Part V will remain in place to cover dealings on unregulated markets).
