**COMPANIES ACT 1990 (PRESCRIBED ALTERNATIVE
 ACCOUNTING STANDARDS BODIES) REGULATIONS
 2005**

These Regulations prescribe the bodies in the United States, Canada and Japan which have the authority to lay down accounting standards with which investment companies may comply. The Regulations are made under Section 260A of the Companies Act 1990 as inserted by Section 28 of the Investment Funds, Companies and Miscellaneous Provisions Act 2005.

**ELECTRICITY REGULATION ACT 1999 (PUBLIC
 SERVICE OBLIGATIONS) (AMENDMENT) ORDER 2005**

Under Section 39 of the Electricity Regulation Act 1999 (No. 23 of 1999) and the Communications Energy and Geological Survey of Ireland (Transfer of Departmental and Ministerial Functions) Order 2002 (S.I. No. 300 of 2002) (and as adapted by the Marine and Natural Resources (Alteration of Name of Department and Title of Minister) Order 2002 (S.I. No. 307 of 2002)), the Minister for Communications, Marine and Natural Resources, Noel Dempsey, T.D. has made the above (Amendment) Order dated 20 July 2005.

The (Amendment) Order imposes a public service obligation (PSO) on the ESB requiring the ESB to purchase the output of renewable electricity generating stations which were awarded contracts under the Sixth Alternative Energy Requirement (AER VI) competition administered by the Department of Communications Marine and Natural Resources.
