The Minister for Health and Children has made the following Statutory Instrument.

### HEALTH (CHARGES FOR IN-PATIENT SERVICES) REGULATIONS, 2005.

*(This note is not part of the Instrument and does not purport to be a legal interpretation).*

Section 53(2)(a) of the Health Act 1970 as amended by the Health (Amendment) Act 2005 provides that the Minister for Health and Children “shall, with the consent of the Minister for Finance, make regulations providing for the imposition of charges for in-patient services in specified circumstances on persons to whom the in-patient services are provided or on specified classes of such persons” and 53(2)(b) allows for the Ministers “specifying the amounts of the charges or the limits to the amounts of the charges to be so made”.

Section 51 of the Health Act, 1970 defines in-patient services as meaning “institutional services provided for persons while maintained in a hospital, convalescent home or home for persons suffering from physical or mental disability or in accommodation ancillary thereto”.

In keeping with this provision, these Regulations have provided for two different classes of persons on whom charges can be levied and the maximum charge which can be imposed in respect of each class.

EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES (MECHANICALLY  
PROPELLED VEHICLE ENTRY INTO SERVICE)  
(AMENDMENT) REGULATION 2005.

The Minister for Transport, Mr. Martin Cullen, T.D., has made the above Statutory Instrument.

These Regulations require that applications to the Revenue Commissioners for the registration of new commercial vehicles (Category NI vans) will also require certificates of conformity with Directive 80/1268/EEC, as amended by Directive 2004/3/EC, in relation to the measurement of carbon dioxide emissions and fuel consumption. These requirements will apply to vans up to 1305 Kgs from 1 January 2006, and to larger vans up to 3500 Kgs with effect from 1 January 2008.
