### HEALTH CONTRIBUTIONS (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 2005.

*This note is not part of the Instrument and does not purport to be a legal interpretation).*

These Regulations amend the Health Contributions Regulations 1979. Section 21 of the Health Contributions Regulations 1979 states that "All sums paid over to the Minister in accordance with Section 13 of the Health Contributions Act 1979 shall be appropriated in aid of the Vote for Health".

These Regulations provide that all sums paid over to the Minister under Section 13 of the Act, including sums in 2004 to be paid in 2005, shall now be appropriated in aid of the Vote for the Health Service Executive.

EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES (JUDGMENTS IN  
MATRIMONIAL MATTERS AND MATTERS OF  
PARENTAL RESPONSIBILITY) REGULATIONS 2005.

The Minister for Justice, Equality and Law Reform in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 3 of the European Communities Act 1972 (No. 27 of 1972) has made Regulations entitled the European Communities (Judgments in Matrimonial Matters and Matters of Parental Responsibility) Regulations 2005.

These Regulations set out the effect on domestic legislations of Council Regulation (EC) No. 2201/2003 concerning jurisdiction and the recognition and enforcement of judgments in matrimonial matters and the matters of parental responsibility, repealing Regulation (EC) No. 1347/2000 and make necessary provision for the good administration of Council Regulation 2201/2003 (Brussels 11 bis).

Provisions in relation to matrimonial matters in Council Regulation (EC) No. 1347/2000 (Brussels II), which applied in the State since 1 March, 2001, are re-stated in Council Regulation 2201/2003 so that the provisions in relation to both matrimonial matters and parental responsibility are in the one Instrument. These Regulations revoke the European Communities (Judgments in Matrimonial Matters and Matters of Parental Responsibility) Regulations, 2001 (S.I. No. 472 of 2001) which related to Council Regulation 1347/2000 and re-state the provisions in that Statutory Instrument which are still relevant.
