3rd CALL FOR PROPOSALS 2005-2006

Proposals are invited from legally recognised bodies involved in vocational training, including training providers and enterprises, for the following measures—Pilot projects, Language Competences Projects; Transnational Networks; Reference Material Projects and Mobility Projects.

All projects with the exception of Mobility, must respond to one of the following Community priorities for 2005 and 2006.

1. Promoting transparency of qualifications.
2. Developing the quality of VET systems and practices.
3. Developing relevant and innovative e-Learning content.
4. Continuous training of teachers and trainers.

Projects may be of up to 2 years in duration, can attract support of up to €200,000 per year and must provide a minimum 25% of co-financing. Mobility project grants are up to a maximum of €5,000 per person for a 12 month placement. The deadline for pre-proposals is 30 September 2005 (Mobility projects have a later deadline of 10 February 2006).
