The Minister for Justice, Equality and Law Reform, Mr Michael McDowell, T.D., has made the following Regulations:

S.I. No. 546 of 2005.

**EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES (PLACING ON THE
 MARKET AND SUPERVISION OF EXPLOSIVES FOR
 CIVIL USES) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 2005.**

These Regulations amend the European Communities (Placing on the Market and Supervision of Explosives for Civil Uses) Regulations 1995 (S.I. No. 115 of 1995). The Regulations implement Commission Directive 2004/57/EC of 23 April 2004 on the identification of pyrotechnic articles and certain ammunition. They provide that Regulations 4 to 9 of S.I. No. 115 of 1995 shall not apply with respect to pyrotechnic articles and certain ammunition specified in the 2004 Directive.

PROHIBITION ORDER No. 1/2005

I, Ger Connolly, Acting Official Censor of Films, have, in accordance with Section 7 of the Video Recordings Act, 1989, examined a video recording containing the video work described in the Schedule hereto and am of opinion that the said work is unfit for viewing because—

the viewing of it would tend, by reason of the inclusion in it of obscene or indecent matter, to deprave or corrupt persons who might view it,

And in the exercise of the powers conferred on me by the said Section 7 hereby prohibit the supply of video recordings containing the said video work.
