COMMISSION FOR TAXI REGULATION

S.I. No. 154 of 2006.

TAXI REGULATION ACT 2003 (SMALL PUBLIC  
SERVICE VEHICLES) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS  
2006.

The Commissioner for Taxi Regulation has made Regulations under the Taxi Regulation Act 2003 entitled above.

These Regulations put in place a number of changes to allow the new national licensing system to operate effectively.

They provide that, in the event that a small public service vehicle licence lapses by virtue of not being renewed on or before its expiry date, an application may be made to the Commission for Taxi Regulation within a period of six months seeking late renewal of the licence on payment of a restoration fee. Where a licence has lapsed for in excess of six months after the expiry date, an application may be made to the District Court seeking late renewal of the licence on payment to the Commission of the restoration fee. Provision is made for a fee to be paid in relation to the transfer of a vehicle licence to another vehicle.

Requirements in relation to taxi signs are modified and the requirement to display a hackney sign or limousine sign is removed.

SERVICE VEHICLES) (FIXED CHARGE OFFENCES)

The Commissioner for Taxi Regulation has made Regulations under the Taxi Regulation Act 2003 entitled above.

These Regulations provide that more than one small public service vehicle licence may not run concurrently in respect of one particular vehicle. Contravention is a fixed charge offence under the Taxi Regulation Act 2003.

They also provide that failure to display a taxi sign as lawfully required is also a fixed charge offence.

These Regulations make a contravention of any provision of Commission Regulation 2807/83 and Council Regulation 2847/93 a contravention of the Sea-Fisheries and Maritime Jurisdiction Act 2006. These Regulations relate to fisheries control systems and rules for the recording of fish catches.

SEA FISHERIES (TECHNICAL CONSERVATION  
MEASURES) REGULATIONS 2006.

These Regulations make a contravention of any provision of Commission Regulation (EEC) No. 3440/84 and Council Regulation (EC) No. 850 of 1998 a contravention of the Sea-Fisheries and Maritime Jurisdiction Act 2006. These Regulations relate to technical conditions for all fishing operations (e.g. permitted nets, species composition of catches, etc.)

SEA FISHERIES (WEIGHING PROCEDURES FOR  
HERRING, MACKEREL AND HORSE MACKEREL)  
REGULATIONS 2006.

These Regulations make a contravention of any provision of the provisions of Part A of Annex III to Council Regulation (EC) No. 51/2006 a contravention of the Sea-Fisheries and Maritime Jurisdiction Act 2006. These Regulations relate to the requirement to weigh catches of certain pelagic species.

FISHING OPPORTUNITIES AND ASSOCIATED  
CONDITIONS (No. 2) REGULATIONS 2006.

These Regulations make a contravention of any provision of Council Regulation (EC) No. 51/2006 a contravention of the Sea-Fisheries and Maritime Jurisdiction Act 2006. These Regulations relate to the Irish quota entitlements and other associated conditions, e.g. Closure area for cod in Celtic Sea.

DEEP SEA FISHING OPPORTUNITIES AND ORANGE  
ROUGHY PROTECTION AREAS REGULATIONS 2006.

These Regulations make a contravention of the provisions of Articles 3, 6 and 7 of Council Regulation (EC) No. 2270/2004 a contravention of the Sea-Fisheries and Maritime Jurisdiction Act 2006. These Regulations relate to the Irish Deep Sea Quota entitlements and to the closure of an area to protect Orange Roughy.

SEA FISHERIES (CONSERVATION AND RATIONAL  
EXPLOITATION OF DEEP-SEA SPECIES)  
REGULATIONS 2006.

These Regulations make a contravention of any provision of Council Regulation 2347/2002 a contravention of the Sea-Fisheries and Maritime Jurisdiction Act 2006. These Regulations identify the designated ports in Ireland for landing of deep-sea species.

**FISHING EFFORT FOR VESSELS IN THE CONTEXT OF THE RECOVERY OF CERTAIN STOCKS REGULATIONS 2006.**

These Regulations make a contravention of any provision of Annex IIa of Council Regulation (EC) No. 51/2006, which establishes, for fishing vessels greater than 10 metres in overall length and operating in certain waters, a fishing effort limitation scheme in the context of the recovery of certain fish stocks, and the provisions of Council Regulation (EC) No. 423/2004 (Cod Recovery Plan) which establishes measures for the recovery of cod stocks and additional conditions for monitoring, inspection and surveillance a contravention of the Sea-Fisheries and Maritime Jurisdiction Act 2006.

**SEA FISHERIES (CONSERVATION AND RATIONAL EXPLOITATION OF COD IN THE NORTH SEA AND TO THE WEST OF SCOTLAND) REGULATIONS 2006.**

These Regulations make a contravention of any provision of Commission Regulation (EC) No. 2056/2001 a contravention of the Sea-Fisheries and Maritime Jurisdiction Act 2006. These Regulations relate to certain technical measures for the recovery of the stock of cod in the North Sea and to the west of Scotland.

**SEA FISHERIES (CONSERVATION AND RATIONAL EXPLOITATION OF COD IN THE IRISH SEA) REGULATIONS 2006.**

These Regulations make a contravention of any provision of Council Regulation (EC) No. 2549/2000 a contravention of the Sea-Fisheries and Maritime Jurisdiction Act 2006. These Regulations relate to certain technical measures for the recovery of the stock of cod in the Irish Sea.

S.I. No. 179 of 2006.

**SEA FISHERIES (CONSERVATION AND RATIONAL EXPLOITATION OF HAKE) REGULATIONS 2006.**

These Regulations make a contravention of any provision of Commission Regulation (EC) No. 494/2002 a contravention of the Sea-Fisheries and Maritime Jurisdiction Act 2006. These Regulations relate to certain technical measures for the recovery of the stock of hake.

S.I. No. 180 of 2006.

**SEA FISHERIES (CONSERVATION AND RATIONAL EXPLOITATION OF HAKE) (No. 2) REGULATIONS 2006.**

These Regulations make a contravention of any provision of Council Regulation (EC) No. 811/2004 a contravention of the Sea-Fisheries and Maritime Jurisdiction Act 2006. These Regulations relate to measures for the recovery of the Northern hake stock. It determines notification arrangements (4 hours advance notification required) and designated ports for the landing of quantities of hake in excess of 2 tonnes.

**SEA FISHERIES (INSPECTION OF FISHING BOATS) REGULATIONS 2006.**

These Regulations make a contravention of any provision of Commission Regulation (EEC) No. 1382/87 a contravention of the Sea-Fisheries and Maritime Jurisdiction Act 2006. These Regulations relate to the detailed rules concerning the inspection of sea-fishing boats.

**SEA FISHERIES (MARKING AND DOCUMENTATION OF SEA-FISHING BOATS) REGULATIONS 2006.**

These Regulations make a contravention of any provision of Commission Regulation (EEC) No. 1381/87 a contravention of the Sea-Fisheries and Maritime Jurisdiction Act 2006. These Regulations relate to certain rules for the marking and documentation of sea-fishing boats.

S.I. No. 183 of 2006.

**SATELLITE BASED VESSEL MONITORING SYSTEMS REGULATIONS 2006.**

These Regulations make a contravention of any provision of Commission Regulation (EC) No. 2244/03 a contravention of the Sea-Fisheries and Maritime Jurisdiction Act 2006. These Regulations require that sea fishing boats exceeding 15 metres in overall length have satellite-based vessel monitoring systems installed. These Regulations do not apply to sea fishing boats used exclusively for aquaculture purposes and operating exclusively inside the baselines.
