COMMISSION FOR TAXI REGULATION

**TAXI REGULATION ACT 2003 (ONE VEHICLE; ONE
LICENCE) REGULATIONS 2006.**

The Commissioner for Taxi Regulation has made Regulations under the Taxi Regulation Act 2003 entitled above.

These Regulations elaborate on earlier Regulations prohibiting the operation of more than one licence in relation to any one vehicle.

They provide that a person may not operate more than one small public service vehicle (SPSV) licence in respect of a single vehicle. They also provide that no two or more people may operate a SPSV licence in respect of a single vehicle.

On change of ownership of a SPSV, the SPSV licence lapses and the existing licence-holder has until the date of expiry of the licence within which to transfer that licence to another vehicle. If the licence-holder fails to transfer the licence to another vehicle before the date of expiry of the licence, the licence will expire on that date.

FISHERIES ACTS 1959 TO 2006

CONSERVATION OF SALMON AND SEA TROUT (AMENDMENT) BYE-LAW NO. 808, 2006

I, John Browne, Minister of State at the Department of Communications, Marine and Natural Resources, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 9 (as amended by section 3 of the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1962 (No. 31 of 1962)) of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act 1959 (No. 14 of 1959), section 33 of the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1962, the Fisheries (Transfer of Departmental Administration and Ministerial Functions) Order 1977 (S.I. No. 30 of 1977) (as adapted by the Marine and Natural Resources (Alteration of Name of Department and Title of Minister) Order 2002 (S.I. No. 307 of 2002)) and the Marine (Delegation of Ministerial Functions) Order 2006 (S.I. No. 82 of 2006), hereby make the following bye-law:

1. (1) This Bye-law may be cited as the Conservation of Salmon and Sea Trout (Amendment) Bye-law No. 808, 2006.

(2) This Bye-law comes into operation on 1 September 2006 and ceases to have effect on 31 December 2006.

2. Article 2 of the Conservation of Salmon and Sea Trout Bye-law No. 803, 2006 is amended by substituting for the definition of “sea trout” the following:

““sea trout” means the migratory form of *Salmo trutta*, but, in respect of Article 4(a), does not include a sea trout which is 40 centimetres or less in length measured in a straight line from the tip of the snout to the fork of the tail;”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Bye-law and does not purport to be a legal interpretation.)

This Bye-law which provides for an amendment to the Conservation of Salmon and Sea Trout Bye-law No. 803, 2006, prohibits in respect of all sea trout (irrespective of size) the use of any fish hooks other than single barbless hooks and imposes a ban on the use of worms as bait.

FOOTNOTE

Section 11 of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act, 1959 as amended by Section 27(b) of the Fisheries (Amendment) Act, 1999 provides that any person aggrieved by this Bye-law may within 28 days after its publication in the Iris Oifigiúil, appeal against same to the High Court.

TO WHOM IT CONCERNS

The Revenue Commissioners hereby give notice pursuant to Section 142 of the Finance Act 2001 that on 4th day of April 2006, one Ford Escort motor vehicle, bearing identification mark IIL7698 was seized by Officers of the Revenue Commissioners under Section 141(1) of the Finance Act 2001 on the grounds that it was liable to forfeiture under Section 139(6) of the Finance Act 1992.

(2) A notice under sub-section (1) shall specify the name and address of the claimant and, in the case of a claimant who is outside the State, the name and address of a Solicitor in the State who is authorised to accept service of any document required to be served on the claimant and to act on behalf of the claimant.
