TOUR OPERATORS (LICENSING) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 2006.

The Commission for Aviation Regulation, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 7 of the Transport (Tour Operators and Travel Agents) Act 1982 (No. 3 of 1982) and section 9 of the Aviation Regulation Act 2001 (No. 1 of 2001), has made Regulations entitled Tour Operators (Licensing) (Amendment) Regulations, 2006.

These Regulations provide for the removal from the Tour Operators (Licensing) Regulations, 1993 certain provisions relating to the application form for a tour operator's licence.
