**ELECTRICITY REGULATION ACT 1999 AND GAS  
 (INTERIM) (REGULATION) ACT 2002 (GAS) LEVY  
 ORDER 2006.**

The Chairperson of the Commission for Energy Regulation, Mr. Tom Reeves, has made a Statutory Instrument under Paragraph 16 of the Schedule to the Electricity Regulation Act 1999 (No. 23 of 1999) as amended by the Gas (Interim) (Regulation) Act 2002 (No. 10 of 2002).

This order imposes a levy on certain specified classes of natural gas undertakings, for the purpose of meeting expenses properly incurred by the Commission for Energy Regulation in the discharge of its function under the Gas Acts 1976 to 2002.

**ROAD TRAFFIC (SIGNS) REGULATIONS 2006.**

These Regulations (operative from 15 December 2006) prescribe a variable message speed limit sign that may be used in a road tunnel to indicate the speed limit that applies, a variable message traffic lane control sign for use in a tunnel to indicate the operation of traffic lane control regulations, a sign to indicate that use of right-hand traffic lane on the right hand side of a two-lane carriageway in a tunnel by specified vehicles is prohibited, a sign to indicate that entry to a public road is prohibited to specified vehicles (by reference to total number of axles) and signs consisting of a STOP disc and a GO or Téigh disc to indicate, at a place on a public road where roadworks are being carried out, that a manual stop/go traffic control system is being operated.

ROAD TRAFFIC (CONTROL OF TRAFFIC)  
REGULATIONS 2006.

These Regulations (operative from 15 December 2006) provide for the application of regulatory provisions which include the regulation of traffic lane control in a road tunnel, the imposition of prohibitions and restrictions on the entry to a specified public road by certain non-passenger vehicles e.g. goods vehicles (by reference to total number of axles) with provision to provide for operative period and exemptions through issue of a permit, the imposition of a prohibition on use by certain vehicles of traffic lane on the right hand side of a carriageway in a road tunnel, regulation for the operation of manual stop/go traffic controls at locations where roadworks are being carried out and an amendment to article 33 of S.I. No. 182 of 1997 & S.I. No. 11 of 2005 to provide that vehicles that are subject to an Ordinary Speed Limit (i.e. large goods vehicles, passenger buses, vehicles towing a trailer, etc) are not prohibited from using the outside lane on a motorway at any location on a motorway where a special speed limit or a roadworks speed limit not exceeding 80km/h applies.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1994 (CONTROL OF TRAFFIC –  
EXEMPTION PERMITS) REGULATIONS 2006.

These Regulations (operative from 15 December 2006) prescribe the charge for the issue of a permit by a local authority in respect of a vehicle to which Regulation 4(1) of Road Traffic Act 1994 (Control of Traffic) Regulations 2006 (S.I. No. 638 of 2006) applies and in respect of a vehicle that is prohibited from using a road tunnel under Toll Road Bye-laws made by a road authority under the Roads Act 1993. The charges prescribed refer to 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011 and 2012.
