EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES (CONTROL OF MAJOR
ACCIDENT HAZARDS INVOLVING DANGEROUS
SUBSTANCES) REGULATIONS 2006

The purpose of these Regulations is to transpose Council Directive 96/82/EC on the control of major accident hazards involving dangerous substances as amended by Directive 2003/105/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council.

The Regulations revoke and replace—

- (i) The European Communities (Control of Major Accident Hazards Involving Dangerous Substances) Regulations 2000 (S.I. No. 476 of 2000), and
- (ii) The European Communities (Control of Major Accident Hazards Involving Dangerous Substances) (Amendment) Regulations 2003 (S.I. No. 402 of 2003).

The Regulations apply to establishments where dangerous substances are present in amounts equal to or exceeding the application thresholds.

Operators of establishments are required to take all necessary measures to prevent the occurrence of major accidents and to limit the consequences of accidents for people and the environment.

The Regulations impose duties in respect of safety management systems preparation of safety reports and emergency preparedness.

The Regulations also deal with provision of advice on major hazards in the context of land-use planning decisions.

The Regulations set out the arrangements for the appointment of competent authorities, enforcement and the provision of information.

The Regulations provide for the levying of charges by competent authorities for duties performed pursuant to these Regulations.

The Central Competent Authority for the purpose of these Regulations is the Health and Safety Authority.

These Regulations also revoke the Mackerel (Fisheries Management and Conservation) (No. 2) Regulations 2006 (S.I. No. 59 of 2006).

WATERFORD COUNTY COUNCIL

**BYELAWS FOR THE COLLECTION, STORAGE AND
PRESENTATION OF HOUSEHOLD WASTE AND
CERTAIN RELATED WASTE MANAGEMENT
MATTERS.**

The Mayor of Waterford County and the councillors of Waterford County in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 35 of the Waste Management Act, 1996 (No.10 of 1996) and Part VII of the Local Government Act, 1994 (No. 8 of 1994) hereby make the following Bye-Laws relating to the collection, storage and presentation of household waste and certain related waste management matters. These byelaws are desirable in the interests of the common good of the local community.

PART 1

Preliminary

Short Title

1. These Byelaws may be cited as the Waterford County Council Control of Collection and Storage of Household Waste Bye-Laws, No.2.

Definitions

2. In these Bye-Laws, except where the context otherwise states:

'*Approved bring site*' means a facility approved by Waterford County Council for acceptance of specified recyclable wastes.

'*Approved waste disposal facility*' means a landfill site that is licensed by the Environmental Protection Agency.

'*Approved waste treatment facility*' means a materials recovery

facility, biological treatment plant or waste to energy plant which is licensed by the Environmental Protection Agency.

'*Authorised Officer*' means an employee authorised under the Waste Management Act 1996

'*Bio waste*' includes both kitchen and garden waste and shall include some or all of both.

'*Bio waste collection system*' means a source separated door to door waste collection system for the collection of bio waste approved by Waterford County Council.

'*Bulky waste*' includes items such as furniture, carpets, fridges etc. which will not fit in the waste containers provided by Waterford County Council

'*Designated time*' means such days and such hours of the day as may be fixed from time to time by Waterford County Council and other permitted household waste collectors, for the removal of household waste from households. The existing designated times will continue until notification is served on the holder/holders of waste indicating a revised schedule.

'*Dry Recyclables*' includes the following materials

- Paper
- Light card/cardboard
- Steel cans
- Aluminium cans
- Clear PVC
- Polyethylene Terephthalate (PET) plastic bottles
- High Density Polyethylene (HDPE) plastic bottles
- Glass
- Beverage Cartons
- Any other recyclable materials, including textiles

'*Footpath*' has the meaning assigned to it by the Roads Act, 1993.

'*Footway*' has the meaning assigned to it by the Roads Act, 1993.

'*Garden waste*' includes waste such as grass clippings, dead flowers, leaves, twigs and other biodegradable waste arising in a garden.

'*Holder*' means in relation to waste, the owner, person in charge or any other person having, for the time being, possession or control of the waste.

'*Household hazardous waste*' means that part of the household waste as may be hazardous and includes those items listed in Appendix B.

'*Household waste*' has the meaning assigned to it by the Waste Management Act 1996.

'*Kitchen waste*' includes fruit, vegetable waste, tea bags and coffee filters etc.

'*Ordinary household waste collection*' means regular collection using waste containers approved by Waterford County Council, excluding bio-waste and dry recyclable waste where separate door-to-door collection systems are in operation.

'*Packaging glass*' means glass bottles and glass jars, which are used to package non-hazardous waste items.

'*Premises*' has the meaning assigned to it by the Waste Management Act 1996.

'*Prescribed place*' in relation to a household means a convenient place immediately outside the entrance to a household or as close as practicable but not in a position to cause an obstruction to users of the roadway, footpath or footway.

'*Recycling centre*' means a facility approved by Waterford County Council and licensed by the Environmental Protection Agency for the acceptance of specified recyclable wastes.

'*Residual waste*' means that fraction of the waste remaining after the dry recyclable and bio waste fractions have been removed.

'*Roadway*' has the meaning assigned to it by the Roads Act, 1993.

'*Separate Door to door collection system*' means a source-separated household waste collection system approved by Waterford County Council.

'*Temporary Collection Centre*' means any location at which mobile collection facilities are provided for up to one day's duration.

'*Waste Container*' includes a wheeled bin or other receptacle approved by Waterford County Council for the storage and collection of household waste.

"*Waterford County Council*" and "*the Council*" means the County Mayor and councillors of Waterford County.

Area of Application

3. These Byelaws apply to the functional area of Waterford County Council, which for the purposes of the Waste Management Act 1996 includes the Dungarvan Town Council administrative area.

PART II

Obligations on Holders of Household Waste

1. STORAGE OF WASTE

- 1.1. The holder of household waste shall keep it in a place within the curtilage of the premises, unless otherwise agreed with an authorised officer of Waterford County Council.
- 1.2. The holder of household waste shall keep the waste container in proper condition and repair so that the waste placed therein may not escape therefrom and so that the waste container may be conveniently emptied.
- 1.3. A person shall not place or put in a waste container provided by the County Council or other permitted

household waste collector, liquid matter, hot ashes or other waste matter likely to damage the container or cause injury to any person.

- 1.4. The holder of household waste shall be responsible for proper care of the waste container and in the event of not doing so shall replace containers which are damaged due to fire, abuse, or are lost, at his/her own expense.
- 1.5. The holder of household waste shall be responsible for ensuring that there are adequate waste containers to comply with provisions concerning sorting at source and to prevent overfilling.
- 1.6. Waste will be collected only in waste containers or some other form of receptacle as may be provided or approved by Waterford County Council.
- 1.7. Dry recyclable waste will only be collected when presented in approved 30 micron density High Density Polyethylene (HDPE) bags which have the Waterford County Council logo embossed thereon. Only bags which have the appropriate Waterford County Council tag / sticker attached will be collected.
- 1.8. Only waste containers which are securely fastened and not overflowing, will be collected.

2. TYPES OF WASTE WHICH MAY BE COLLECTED

- 2.1. The holder of household waste is responsible for sorting waste into separate fractions as described in Appendix A to facilitate door-to-door collection of dry recyclables and bio waste.
- 2.2. Only household waste may be collected from a household.
- 2.3. Bulky waste will not be collected in the ordinary household waste collection.
- 2.4. Waste of the types described in Appendix A must be sorted and placed in the correct waste container (when provided by the County Council or with the approval of the County Council) and presented for collection as described in paragraph 3.
- 2.5. Packaging glass and other wastes designated by Waterford County Council from time to time must be disposed of at approved bring sites or recycling centres. Other glass will not be collected in the household waste or recyclable waste collection and must be disposed of at approved recycling centres.
- 2.6. Household hazardous waste must be segregated and disposed of at an approved waste treatment facility/recycling centre/bring site/temporary collection centre.
- 2.7. A person shall not burn household waste.
- 2.8. Any waste disposal measures undertaken by the holder of household waste must provide for the disposal of such waste to an approved waste treatment or disposal facility or to a facility approved by Waterford County Council or an adjoining local authority.

3. PRESENTATION OF WASTE FOR COLLECTION

- 3.1. Recyclable waste presented for collection shall be in respect of a household situated in the functional area of Waterford County Council. This waste may only be presented for collection in a prescribed place in a transparent plastic bag (30 micron density High Density Polyethylene (HDPE) bags which have the Waterford County Council logo embossed thereon), appropriately tagged, or some other form of receptacle as may be provided or approved by Waterford County Council for use in the door to door collection system. Recyclable waste presented for collection which includes residual waste or bio waste will not be collected. It shall be an offence to present recyclable waste for collection in this way.
- 3.2. Bio waste presented for collection shall be in respect of a household situated in the functional area of Waterford County Council. This waste may only be presented for collection in a prescribed place in such receptacle (termed a "brown bin" in Appendix A) as may be provided or approved by Waterford County Council for use in any bio waste collection system that may be introduced. Bio waste presented for collection, which includes either residual waste or recyclable waste, will not be collected. It shall be an offence to present bio waste for collection in this way.
- 3.3. Residual waste presented for collection shall be in respect of a household situated in the functional area of Waterford County Council. This waste may only be presented for collection in a prescribed place in a receptacle (black/grey bin) or other receptacles provided or approved by Waterford County Council for use in the ordinary household waste collection system. Residual waste presented for collection which includes recyclable waste (or bio waste when a separate bio waste collection is introduced) will not be collected. It shall be an offence to present residual waste for collection in this way.
- 3.4. Waste from a household may only be presented for collection in a prescribed place at designated times in relation to the premises.
- 3.5. Waste containers and any uncollected waste must be removed from the public area on the day of collection or within 12 hours after the collection time designated in the existing schedule.
- 3.6. All tags/stickers placed on the waste receptacles being used for collection must include the name and address of the waste holder.
- 3.7. It shall be an offence for a person to interfere with waste presented for collection by another person.
- 3.8. A person shall not remove, damage, destroy, tamper with, render inoperative or otherwise interfere with a micro-chip implanted in a bin.

4. APPROVED TIMES FOR COLLECTION OF WASTE

- 4.1 The existing schedules for the collection of waste will continue unless notification is served on the holder/holders of waste indicating a revised schedule.

5. GENERAL

- 5.1 A person who contravenes a provision of these Byelaws shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine.
- 5.2 As an alternative to a prosecution for the contravention of a byelaw, a person who contravenes a provision of these Byelaws may be served with a notice, specifying a fixed payment of €31.74 to be made to Waterford County Council. A prosecution in respect of an offence will not be instituted during the period of 21 days beginning on the date of service of the notice, if during that period the person pays the fixed payment.
- 5.2 All waste collected in the functional area of Waterford County Council will be regulated by Waterford County Council in accordance with the Waste Management (Collection Permit) Regulations, 2001.
- 5.3 The commencement date of these byelaws will be 13th October 2005.
- 5.4 From and after the date of commencement of these byelaws, any previous bye-laws of Waterford County Council with respect to the presentation for collection of any waste, shall be repealed.

Appendix A

The following waste streams must be sorted at the household and placed in appropriate containers as set out in Table 1 below:
