**EDUCATION ACT 1998 (COMPOSITION OF NATIONAL
 COUNCIL FOR CURRICULUM AND ASSESSMENT)
 ORDER 2003.**

On the 9th January, 2003, the Minister for Education and Science, Mr. Noel Dempsey T.D., signed an order as entitled above pursuant to the provisions of section 40(1) of the Education Act 1998. The order, signed following consultation with school patrons, national associations of parents, recognised trade unions and staff associations representing teachers and other bodies, expanded the composition of the National Council for Curriculum and Assessment to include a representative of each of the following bodies: the National Association of Boards of Management in Special Education, the Centre for Early Childhood Development and Education, Foras na Gaeilge, and the State Examinations Commission. The Order also made changes in respect of the Vice-Chairpersonship of the Council. The previous composition Order made in respect of the NCCA, (S.I. 247/2001), was revoked.

On 13th February, 2003, consequent to a presentation to the Joint Committee on the proposed State Examinations Commission, the Joint Committee sent messages to each of the Houses of the Oireachtas in approval of the draft Order. On the 20th and 25th February, 2003 Dáil Éireann and Seanad Éireann passed their respective motions of approval. On the 6th March, 2003 the Minister for Education and Science, Mr. Noel Dempsey T.D., signed the order, made in accordance with the provisions of section 54 of the Education Act 1998, establishing the State Examinations Commission. In concurrence with the making of the Order, An Taoiseach, Mr. Bertie Aleron T.D., signed the Order on behalf of the Government on 8th April, 2003.

CELTIC SEA HERRING (FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION) REGULATIONS 2006.

These Regulations allow Irish sea-fishing boats to land or tranship herring caught in the Celtic Sea, or that part of the exclusive fishery limits of the State that lies south of the line of latitude of 52°30' North, from 24 January 2006, provided that the herring does not exceed 5% by weight of the total catch landed or transhipped on any occasion.
