## ROAD TRAFFIC (REQUIREMENT TO HAVE AUDIBLE WARNING DEVICES ON VEHICLES) REGULATIONS 2006

These Regulations consolidate and update the statutory provisions in relation to the use of sirens on certain vehicles. Under the Regulations, sirens may be used on vehicles used by the Gardaí, the fire service, an ambulance service, the Irish Marine Emergency Service, the Irish Prison Service and vehicles used for the delivery or collection of human transplant organs, human blood or human blood products.

These Regulations complement the Road Traffic (Lighting of Vehicles) (Blue and Amber Lamps) Regulations 2006 (S.I. No. 342 of 2006) which amend the Road Traffic (Lighting of Vehicles) Regulations 1963 to 1996 to permit the use of blue flashing lights on certain vehicles.

## ROAD TRAFFIC (LIGHTING OF VEHICLES) (BLUE AND AMBER LAMPS) REGULATIONS 2006

These Regulations consolidate and update the statutory provisions in relation to the use of flashing blue or amber warning lights on certain vehicles. Under the Regulations, blue flashing lights may be used on vehicles used by the Gardaí, the fire service, an ambulance service, the Irish Marine Emergency Service, the Irish Prison Service and vehicles used for the delivery or collection of human transplant organs, human blood or human blood products.

Amber lights may be used on a breakdown vehicle, a road clearance vehicle, a road works vehicle, a vehicle used in the collection and disposal of refuse, a vehicle used in the provision or maintenance of telephone services or of gas or electricity supply and a Customs and Excise patrol vehicle.

These Regulations complement the Road Traffic (Requirement to have Audible Warning Devices on Vehicles) Regulations 2006 (S.I. No. 340 of 2006) which amend the Road Traffic (Construction, Equipment and Use of Vehicles) Regulations 1963 to 1996 to permit the use of sirens on certain vehicles.

EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES (ENFORCEMENT OF  
INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS) REGULATIONS  
2006

Micheál Martin, Minister for Enterprise, Trade and Employment, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 3 of the European Communities Act 1972 (No. 27 of 1972), has made Regulations entitled as above.

The purpose of these Regulations, which were signed into law on the 5th July 2006, is to transpose into Irish law those aspects of Directive 2004/48/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council of 29 April 2004 on the Enforcement of Intellectual Property Rights which are not currently available under Irish law. The directive harmonises civil remedies and measures available for the enforcement of Intellectual Property Rights across the European Community.

DUBLIN METROPOLITAN DISTRICT  
COURTS (SUPPLEMENTAL PROVISIONS) ACT, 1961.

DETERMINATION OF THE CLASS OR CLASSES OF BUSINESS TO BE TRANSACTED IN THE SEVERAL PLACES APPOINTED BY THE MINISTER FOR JUSTICE EQUALITY AND LAW REFORM UNDER SECTION 40 OF THE ABOVE ACT FOR THE TRANSACTION OF BUSINESS OF THE COURT IN THE ABOVE DISTRICT AND THE DAYS AND HOURS AT WHICH SUCH CLASS OF CLASSES OF BUSINESS SHALL BE TRANSACTED IN THE SEVERAL PLACES SO APPOINTED.

I, Miriam Malone, Uachtarán na Cúirte Dúiche, (President of the District Court), in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 42 of the above Act DO HEREBY DETERMINE that the class of business to be transacted in each of the several places appointed by the Minister for Justice, Equality and Law Reform under section 40 of that Act for the transaction of the business of the District Court in the Dublin Metropolitan District and the days and hours at which such class or classes of business shall be transacted in the several places so appointed shall be as set out in the schedule hereto provided, however, that none of such business shall be transacted during the following period:—

(a) the month of August,

(b) the period of six consecutive days commencing on the Thursday before Easter Day,

(c) the period of nine consecutive days commencing on the 23rd December,

Nothing herein shall be deemed to limit or restrict the powers conferred on Judges:—

(i) to hold a sitting of the District Court within said District for the preliminary examination of indictable offences at any place or time not appointed herein, or

(ii) by section 27 of the Courts of Justice Act, 1953, or by rules of court.

ALL PREVIOUS DETERMINATION ORDERS ARE  
HEREBY REVOKED.

## APPENDICES

APPENDIX 1  
(CIVIL BUSINESS)

Civil Business shall consist of

Civil proceedings instituted by civil process (excluding all ejectment civil proceedings) and all causes and matters arising out of or appertaining to such proceedings.

APPENDIX 2  
(JUVENILE BUSINESS)

Juvenile business shall consist of:—

1. The preliminary examination of indictable crimes and offences alleged against children and young persons, and the hearing of all other informations, complaints and charges against children and young persons.
2. The preliminary examination of indictable crimes and offences alleged against adults and all other informations, complaints and charges against adults where the adult is either charged jointly with a child or young person or charged with a crime or offence arising out of or relating to a crime or offence in respect of which a child or young person is charged.
3. All applications for orders or licences relating to a child or young person at which the attendance of the child or young person is required.
4. All informations, complaints and charges under the School Attendance Act, 1926/1967.
5. All applications under section 74 and 75 of the Children Act, 1908, as amended by the Children Acts, 1930 to 1997, and the Status of Children Act, 1987.
6. Proceedings for the estreating of any recognizance which is entered into consequent on an order made in relation to the business mentioned in paragraphs 1, 2 or 4 hereof.

APPENDIX 3  
(CUSTODY BUSINESS)

Custody business shall consist of:—

- A. The preliminary examination of indictable crimes and offences and the hearing of summary charges ancillary to such crimes or offences (whether the defendant shall have been summoned or arrested), except the preliminary examination of such indictable crimes and offences as are included in Appendix 2.
- B. (1) all other informations, complaints and summary charges in respect of which the defendant shall have been arrested except:—
  - (i) such informations, complaints or summary charges as are included in Appendix 2, and

(ii) proceedings under section 8 of the Enforcement of Courts Orders Act, 1940 and Courts (No. 2) Act, 1986.

- (2) All summary charges under sections 220 to 225 inclusive of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and section 65 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906/1983.
- C. All applications for warrants of arrest or search.
- D. The making of orders for the condemnation and destruction of diseased, unsound or unwholesome foodstuffs, under the Public Health Acts.
- E. All applications under the Police (Property) Act, 1897.
- F. Proceedings for the estreating of any recognizance which is entered into consequent on an order made in relation to the business mentioned in paragraphs A and B hereof and which is deposited with the Chief Clerk of the Dublin Metropolitan District Court.

APPENDIX 4  
(SUMMARY BUSINESS)

Summary business shall consist of:—

- A. All complaints of a criminal nature being dealt with in a summary manner and all summary charges in respect of which a summons shall have been issued against the defendant except such complaints or summary charges as are included in Appendix 2 or Appendix 3.
- B. (1) All civil processes in ejectment.
  - (2) All applications and proceedings under the Rent Restrictions Act, 1960, the amending Act of 1967 and the Housing (Private Rented Dwellings) Act, 1982, and proceedings by way of summons under section 15 of the Summary Jurisdiction (Ireland) Act, 1851, as extended by section 34(2) of the Rent Restrictions Act, 1960.
  - (3) Proceedings under the Housing (Private Rented Dwellings) Act, 1982.
  - (4) Complaints by way of summons brought by the Dublin Corporation, Fingal County Council, South Dublin County Council or the Dún Laoghaire Rathdown County Council for the recovery of rates.
  - (5) Proceedings by way of summons under the Cottier Tenants (Ireland) Act, 1856, and section 81,84,85 and 86 (as amended and extended in the case of the last-mentioned section by section 7 of the Land Law (Ireland) Act, 1887) of the Landlord and Tenant Law Amendment Act (Ireland) Act, 1887) of the Landlord and Tenant Law Amendment Act (Ireland) 1860.
  - (6) Proceedings in ejectment instituted by summons by the Dublin Corporation.
- C. (1) Applications for the temporary transfer of licences, special exemption orders, restaurant certificates, certificates for the grant of wholesale beer dealers'

- licences and occasional licences, public dance hall licences and authorisations under section 21 of the Intoxicating Liquor (General) Act, 1924, as amended by the 1927, 1960, 1962 and Courts (No. 2) Act, 1986 for the supply of excisable liquors in registered clubs, game dealers' licences and all other licensing applications not hereinbefore specified.
- (2) The Annual Licensing District Court for the hearing of applications for certificates of transfer, certificates of character by licensed vintners, spirit grocers, wholesale and retail beer dealers, for general exemption orders, restaurant certificates and for public dance hall licences.
- (3) The Licensing District Court for the hearing of applications for certificates of character by licensed pawnbrokers.
- (4) The Licensing District Court for the grant of certificates to applicants for moneylenders' licences.
- (5) The Licensing District Court for the grant of general dealers' licences.
- (6) Appeals under the Betting Act, 1931, jurisdiction to hear which is conferred on the District Court under the said Act and the Betting Acts 1853, 1874, 1906 and 1931.
- (7) Applications for renewal of certificates of registration of clubs, objections to such applications, complaints under section 9(1) of the Registration of Clubs (Ireland) Act, 1904, as amended by the Intoxicating Liquor Act, 1988, cancellation of certificates of registration of clubs under section 9(2) and the making and cancellation of an order under section 9(3) of the said Act.
- (8) Applications for certificates of Qualification under the Auctioneers and House Agents Act, 1947, 1967 and 1973.
- (9) Applications under the Gaming and Lotteries Acts, 1956/1970/1979.
- D. (1) Applications and proceedings under section 8 of the Enforcement of Court Orders Act, 1940, as amended by the Courts (No. 2) Act, 1986; Part 11 and Part 111 of the Guardianship of Infants Act, 1964; the Maintenance Orders Act, 1974; the Family Law (Maintenance of Spouses and Children) Act, 1976; the Family Home Protection Act, 1976; the Family Law (Protection of Spouses and Children) Act, 1976; the Family Law Act, 1981; the Status of Children Act, 1987; Social Welfare Act, 1993; Family Law Act, 1995; Domestic Violence Act, 1996 and Children Act, 1997.
- (2) Sanitary and dangerous buildings summonses and complaints consequent on defaults in compliance with orders made on sanitary summonses.
- (3) Applications under section 4 of the Acquisition of Derelict Sites Act, 1940/1961, for the annulment of preliminary orders of Sanitary Authorities made under section 3 of the said Act.
- (4) Applications by Public Assistance Authorities to recover the costs of (a) public assistance; (b) general assistance, under the provisions of sections 28 and 29 respectively of the Public Assistance Act, 1939, and applications by Public Assistance Authorities under section 30(3)(b) of the said Act.
- (5) Complaints under section 16 of the Summary jurisdiction (Ireland) Act, 1851 (i.e. complaints for recovery of wages, hireage and tuition fees), and under section 17(1) of the same Act (i.e. disputes at sales in fairs and markets).
- (6) Applications and proceedings under the Enforcement of Court Orders Act, 1926, 1940 and the Courts (No. 20) Act, 1986.
- (7) Proceedings in relation to disputes or matters in respect of which jurisdiction is given by the Employers and Workmen Act, 1875, to a Court of Summary Jurisdiction.
- (8) Claims under section 164, 167(1) and 167(2) of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894/1983.
