Road Traffic (Special Speed Limits) (County of Meath)
Bye-Laws No 1 of 2006

N2 Finglas To Ashbourne Road Scheme

Meath County Council in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 9 of the Road Traffic Act, 2004 (No. 44 of 2004) has made the following bye-laws in respect of the area comprising the administrative County of Meath.

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Road Traffic (Special Speed Limits) (County of Meath) Bye-Laws No 1 of 2006.

2. These bye-laws shall come into operation on the 15th day of June 2006.

3. In these bye-laws:—

“the Act of 1993” means the Roads Act, 1993 (No. 14 of 1993);

“the Act of 2004” means the Road Traffic Act, 2004 (No. 44 of 2004);

“built up area” has the meaning assigned to it by the Act of 2004;

“distance” means distance measured along the centre line of a road;

“the Minister” means the Minister for the Environment and Local Government;

“national road” has the meaning assigned to it by the Act of 1993;

“regional road” has the meaning assigned to it by the Act of 1993;

“local road” has the meaning assigned to it by the Act of 1993;

“motorway” has the meaning assigned to it by the Act of 1993;

“road” means a public road and includes a motorway;

“perimeter road” means a road on and along the roadway of which there runs the boundary of a county and shall be considered as being within such boundary for the purposes of these by-laws.

“Rath Roundabout” means the roundabout north of Ashbourne in the townland of Rath at the junction of the N2: Finglas — Ashbourne Road Scheme (N2) national road and the R135 (Old N2) regional road.

“Nine Mile Stone Roundabout” means the roundabout south of Ashbourne in the townlands of Baltrasna, Donaghmore and Fleenstown Little at the junction of the N2: Finglas — Ashbourne Road Scheme (N2) national road and the R135 (Old N2) regional road and the R125 regional road.

“South Ashbourne Link” means the N2: Finglas — Ashbourne Road Scheme (N2) national road dual carriageway connecting the N2: Finglas — Ashbourne Road Scheme (N2) national road to the Nine Mile Stone Roundabout.

“South Ashbourne Interchange” means the interchange on the N2: Finglas — Ashbourne Road Scheme (N2) national road in the townland of Fleenstown Little 5,600 metres south of Rath Roundabout which connects N2: Finglas — Ashbourne Road Scheme (N2) national road to the South Ashbourne Link (N2) national road.

4. (i) One Hundred and Twenty (120) kilometres per hour shall be the speed limit for mechanically propelled vehicles on the roads specified in the first schedule to these bye-laws;

(ii) Eighty (80) kilometres per hour shall be the speed limit for mechanically propelled vehicles on the roads specified in the second schedule to these bye-laws;

(iii) Sixty (60) kilometres per hour shall be the speed limit for mechanically propelled vehicles on the roads specified in the third schedule to these bye-laws.

5. There shall be exempted from the special speed limits prescribed in article no 4 of these byelaws and from the built-up area speed limit the following:—

(a) ambulance,

(b) fire brigade vehicles, and

(c) vehicles used by members of the Garda Síochána in the performance of their duties as such members.

(d) any vehicle subject to a speed limit as prescribed by The Minister pursuant to Section 4 of the Road Traffic Act 2004

First Schedule

Roads in respect of which the special speed limit shall of one hundred and twenty (120) kilometres per hour is prescribed.

1. N2: Finglas — Ashbourne Road Scheme (N2) national road

a. On both carriageways from a point 1,016 metres south of the centre line of circulating roadway of the Rath

Roundabout for a distance of 9,870 metres south of the same point.

- b. On the southbound carriageway only from a point 616 metres south of the centre line of circulating roadway of the Rath Roundabout for a distance of 400 metres south of the same point.

Second Schedule

Roads in respect of which the special speed limit of eighty (80) kilometres per hour is prescribed.

1. N2: Finglas — Ashbourne Road Scheme (N2) national road

- a. For a distance of 415 metres west along the westbound carriageway only of the South Ashbourne Link (N2) national road from a point 135 metres southwest of the centre line of circulating roadway of the Nine Mile Stone Roundabout.
- b. For a distance of 155 metres west along the westbound carriageway only of the South Ashbourne Link (N2) national road from a point 543 metres southwest of the centre line of circulating roadway of the Nine Mile Stone Roundabout.
- c. The northbound “free-flow on-ramp” at the South Ashbourne Interchange.

Third Schedule

Roads in respect of which the special speed limit of sixty (60) kilometres per hour is prescribed.

1. N2: Finglas — Ashbourne Road Scheme (N2) national road

- a. For a distance of 156 metres south along the southbound carriageway only from the centre line of the circulating roadway of the Rath Roundabout.
- b. For a distance of 516 metres south along the northbound carriageway only from the centre line of the circulating roadway of the Rath Roundabout.
- c. For a distance of 135 metres west along the westbound carriageway only of the South Ashbourne Link (N2) national road from the centre line of the circulating roadway of the Nine Mile Stone Roundabout.
- d. For the entire length of the eastbound carriageway only of the South Ashbourne Link.
- e. The circulating roadway of the Rath Roundabout.
- f. The southbound “free-flow off-ramp” at the South Ashbourne Interchange.
- g. The northbound “free-flow off-ramp” at the South Ashbourne Interchange.
- h. The northbound “free-flow on-ramp” at the South Ashbourne Interchange

2. N2 national road

- a. For a distance of 423 metres north from the centre line of the circulating roadway of the Rath Roundabout.

3. R135 (Old N2) regional road

- a. The southbound “free-flow slip road” onto the N2: Finglas - Ashbourne Road Scheme (N2) national road at Rath Roundabout.

- b. For a distance of 670 metres south from the centre line of the circulating roadway of the Rath Roundabout.

- c. From the centre line of the circulating roadway of the Nine Mile Stone Roundabout northwest to a point 36 metres northwest of its junction with the L50193 local road (Baltrasna road).

- d. For a distance of 170 metres southeast from the centre line of the circulating roadway of the Nine Mile Stone Roundabout.

4. R125 Ratoath — Swords regional road

- a. From a point 733 metres west of the centre line of the circulating roadway of the Nine Mile Stone Roundabout to a point 161 metres east of the centre line of the circulating roadway of the Nine Mile Stone Roundabout.
- b. The circulating roadway of the Nine Mile Stone Roundabout.

5. Local roads

- a. For a distance of 105 metres west along the LT50161 local road (Curraha road) from its junction with the N2 national road.
- b. For a distance of 950 metres southwest along the LS5018 local road (Ballybin road) from its junction with the N2 national road.
- c. For a distance of 220 metres northeast along the LS5018 local road (Ballymadun road) from its junction with the N2 national road.
- d. For a distance of 100 metres south along the LS5032 local road (Fleenstown Lane) from its junction with the Ratoath Road regional road (R125).
- e. For the entire length of the L50193 local road (Baltrasna road) from its junction with the R135 (Old N2) regional road to its junction with the Ratoath Road regional road (R125).
