## BLUE WHITING (FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION) REGULATIONS 2006.

These Regulations prohibit fishing for, transshipment, landing or having on board blue whiting by Irish sea-fishing boats in ICES Divisions I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, VIIIabde, XII and XIV (EC and international waters) with effect from 3 March 2006.
