### NOTICE OF ISSUE OF A CODE OF PRACTICE

The Health and Safety Authority (by virtue of Section 60 of the Safety, Health and Welfare at Work Act 2005 (No. 10 of 2005)) following consultation with the statutory advisory committee on safety and health in agriculture, referred to as the Farm Safety Partnership, and general public consultation through its website, with the consent of Mr. Tony Killeen, Minister of State at the Department of Enterprise, Trade and Employment, has issued a Code of Practice entitled “Code of Practice for Preventing Injury and occupational Ill Health in Agriculture”. (The Code of Practice incorporates a Safe System of Work Plan (SSWP) and a Risk Assessment Document.)

The aim of this Code of Practice is to improve the level of safety and health among all people engaged in the Agriculture sector by providing practical guidance with respect to the observance of the Safety, Health and Welfare at Work Act 2005, including the provisions of sections 19 and 20 of the Act.

The Code of Practice comes into effect on 1 November 2006.

Copies of this Code of Practice are available from the Health and Safety Authority.

## DETERMINATION (No. 3) OF THE NEED FOR AN AUTHORISATION FOR CERTAIN FISH STOCKS

I, John Browne, Minister of State at the Department of Communications, Marine and Natural Resources, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 13(15) of the Sea-Fisheries and Maritime Jurisdiction Act 2006 (“the Act”) and the Marine (Delegation of Ministerial Functions) (No. 2) Order 2006, hereby determine:

1. With effect from 1 October 2006, an authorisation, granted under section 13(1) of the Act, is required by an Irish sea-fishing boat of a type specified in column (3) of the Schedule to this Determination to fish for, retain on board, trans-ship or land from that boat the fish stock, or group of fish stocks, given in column (2) of that Schedule opposite that type of boat.

2. In this Determination, the ICES areas mentioned in column (2) of the Schedule to this Determination refer to the waters falling within those ICES sub-areas and divisions as they are defined in Regulation (EEC) No. 3880/91 of 17 December 1991<sup>1</sup>, as amended.

3. This Determination revokes and replaces the Determination (No. 2) of the Need for an Authorisation for Certain Fish Stocks issued by me on 15 June 2006.

(a) It is prohibited for an Irish sea-fishing boat greater than or equal to 55 feet in length, or for a person on board that boat, fishing in a fishing area listed in column (2) of Schedule 1 to this Notice, to have or retain on board or land, during the specified period, more of the species of fish given in column (1) of that Schedule opposite that fishing area than the corresponding quantity specified in column (3) of that Schedule if that fish was caught in that fishing area during the specified period.

(b) It is prohibited for an Irish sea-fishing boat less than 55 feet in length, or for a person on board that boat, fishing in a fishing area listed in column (2) of Schedule 1 to this Notice, to have or retain on board or land, during the specified period, more of the species of fish given in column (1) of that Schedule opposite that fishing area than the corresponding quantity specified in column (4) of that Schedule if that fish was caught in that fishing area during the specified period.

5. (a) It is prohibited for an Irish sea-fishing boat greater than or equal to 55 feet in length to which a 2006 monkfish authorisation has not been granted, or for a person on board that boat, fishing in a fishing area listed in column (2) of Schedule 2 to this Notice, to have or retain on board or land, during the specified period, more of the species of fish given in column (1) of that Schedule opposite that fishing area than the corresponding quantity specified in column (3) of that Schedule if that fish was caught in that fishing area during the specified period.

(b) It is prohibited for an Irish sea-fishing boat less than 55 feet in length to which a 2006 monkfish authorisation has not been granted, or for a person on board that boat, fishing in a fishing area listed in column (2) of Schedule 2 to this Notice, to have or retain on board or land, during the specified period, more of the species of fish given in column (1) of that Schedule opposite that fishing area than the corresponding quantity specified in column (4) of that Schedule if that fish was caught in that fishing area during the specified period.

(c) Notwithstanding paragraphs 5(a) and 5(b) of this Notice, it is prohibited for an Irish sea-fishing boat that does not hold a valid monkfish authorisation, or for a person on board that boat, fishing in fishing areas VIIa or VIIb-k, to have or retain on board or land, during the specified period, more haddock than the quantity of haddock specified in column (5) of Schedule 2 to this Notice for that fishing area if that haddock was caught in that fishing area during the specified period.
