The Minister for the Department of the Environment, Heritage and Local Government has made the following Statutory Instrument.

EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES (ENERGY PERFORMANCE
OF BUILDINGS) REGULATIONS 2006.

(This note is not part of the Instrument and does not purport to be a legal interpretation).

These Regulations provide for the legal transposition and implementation of articles 5 and 7 of the EU Energy Performance of Buildings Directive (2002/91/EC of 16 December 2002).

The Regulations require the designers of large buildings (total useful floor area of more than 1000 m²) to consider, during the design stage, the economic, environmental and technical feasibility of installing alternative/renewable energy systems-including combined heat and power (CHP), district or block heating if available and heat pumps. This requirement will apply to large buildings for which planning permission is applied for on or after 1 January 2007.

The Regulations also require the Building Energy Rating (BER) of buildings as follows:

- new Dwellings commencing on or after 1 January 2007;
- new Non-Domestic Buildings commencing on or after 1 July 2008; and
- existing buildings, when let or sold, on or after 1 January 2009.

The operative dates for BER cited above will not apply to:

- new Dwellings for which planning permission is applied for on or before 31 December 2006 and which are substantially completed by 30 June 2008; and
- new Non-Domestic buildings for which planning permission is applied for on or before 30 June 2008 and which are substantially completed by 30 June 2010.

A limited number of building categories are exempt from the Regulations, as envisaged in the relevant EU Directive e.g. protected structures, places of worship.

TO WHOM IT CONCERNS

The Revenue Commissioners hereby give notice pursuant to Section 142 of the Finance Act 2001 that on 14 July 2006, one Renault 19 motor vehicle, bearing identification mark RJI 1008 was seized by Officers of the Revenue Commissioners under Section 141(1) of the Finance Act 2001 on the grounds that it was liable to forfeiture under Section 139(6) of the Finance Act 1992.

No. 30 of 1977) (as adapted by the Marine and Natural Resources (Alteration of Name of Department and Title of Minister) Order 2002 (S.I. No. 307 of 2002)) and the Marine (Delegation of Ministerial Functions) Order 2006 (S.I. No. 82 of 2006), and having complied with the requirements of Regulation 31 of the European Communities (Natural Habitats) Regulations 1997 (S.I. No. 94 of 1997), hereby make the following bye-law:

1. (1) This Bye-law may be cited as the Conservation of Salmon and Sea Trout Bye-law No. 815, 2006.

(2) This Bye-law comes into operation on 1 January 2007.

2. In this Bye-law—

“salmon” means fish of the species *Salmo salar* (Atlantic salmon);

“sea trout” means fish of the migratory form of *Salmo trutta*, but does not include a sea trout which is 40 centimetres or less in length measured in a straight line from the tip of the snout to the fork of the tail.

3. It is prohibited for a person, in a river mentioned in column (2) of the Schedule opposite mention of a fishery district in column (1) of the Schedule, to —

(a) notwithstanding anything contained in the Conservation of Salmon and Sea Trout Bye-law 814, 2006, take by rod and line any salmon or sea trout from the waters of the river, unless the fish is handled carefully, not removed from and immediately returned alive to, those waters, or

(b) use or attempt to use any fish hooks, other than single barbless hooks, or worms as bait in angling for salmon or sea trout in the waters of the river.

No. 30 of 1977) (as adapted by the Marine and Natural Resources (Alteration of Name of Department and Title of Minister) Order 2002 (S.I. No. 307 of 2002)) and the Marine (Delegation of Ministerial Functions) Order 2006 (S.I. No. 82 of 2006), and having complied with the requirements of Regulation 31 of the European Communities (Natural Habitats) Regulations 1997 (S.I. No. 94 of 1997), hereby make the following bye-law:

1. (1) This Bye-law may be cited as the Conservation of Salmon and Sea Trout Bye-law No. 814, 2006.

(2) This Bye-law comes into operation on 1 January 2007.

2. In this Bye-law—

“salmon” means fish of the species *Salmo salar* (Atlantic salmon);

“sea trout” means fish of the migratory form of *Salmo trutta*, but does not include a sea trout which is 40 centimetres or less in length measured in a straight line from the tip of the snout to the fork of the tail.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in any bye-law prohibiting the taking or having in possession of more than a specified number of salmon or sea trout, a person shall not take by rod and line more than 10 fish (being either salmon or sea trout or a combination of both) in any year.

4. Subject to Article 5, a person shall not take by rod and line—

(a) during the year 2007 from 1 January to 12 May, more than one fish,

(b) on any day in any year,—

(i) from 13 May to 31 August, more than 3 fish, or

(ii) from 1 September to the end of the season, more than one fish,

being either salmon or sea trout

5. It is prohibited for a person, in a river mentioned in column (2) of the Schedule opposite mention of a fishery district in column (1) of the Schedule, where he or she has taken the number of fish permitted under Article 4, to—

- (a) take by rod and line any salmon or sea trout from the waters of the river, unless the fish is handled carefully, not removed from and immediately returned alive, to those waters, or
- (b) use or attempt to use any fish hooks, other than single barb less hooks, or worms as bait in angling for salmon or sea trout in the waters of the river.

6. The Conservation of Salmon and Sea Trout Bye-law No. 802, 2006 is revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Bye-law and does not purport to be a legal interpretation).

This Bye-Law provides for an annual bag limit of 10 fish for 2007, a season bag limit of 1 fish in the period 1 Jan to 12 May, a daily bag limit of 3 fish from 13 May to 31 August and a daily bag limit of 1 fish from 1 September to the end of the season. The Bye-law also provides for the use of single hooks and prohibits the use of worms as bait once the specified number of fish have been caught in the specified periods and revokes the existing limit Bye-law.

FOOTNOTE

Section 11 of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act, 1959 provides that any person aggrieved by this Bye-law may within 28 days after its publication in the Irish Oifigiúil, appeal against same to the High Court.
