The purpose of these Regulations is to give effect to EU Directive 2003/72/EC of 22 July, 2003, "Supplementing the Statute for a European Co-operative Society with Regard to the Involvement of Employees".

The European Co-operative Society Statute is a new legal instrument that enables the establishment of a European Co-operative Society (to be known as an "SCE"), the objective of which is to make it easier for co-operatives to operate across the EU.

These Regulations transpose the provisions of the Directive, providing that a new SCE cannot be registered without first negotiating with employees on their involvement in the Co-operative, whether through information and consultation and/or, in certain circumstances, participation at board level.

CONSERVATION OF BROWN TROUT BYE-LAW  
No. 823, 2007

I, John Browne, Minister of State at the Department of Communications, Marine and Natural Resources, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 9 (as amended by section 3 of the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1962 (No. 31 of 1962)) of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act 1959 (No. 14 of 1959), section 33 of the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1962, the Fisheries (Transfer of Departmental Administration and Ministerial Functions) Order 1977 (S.I. No. 30 of 1977) (as adapted by the Marine and Natural Resources (Alteration of Name of Department and Title of Minister) Order 2002 (S.I. No. 307 of 2002)), the Marine (Delegation of Ministerial Functions) Order 2006 (S.I. No. 82 of 2006) and the Marine (Delegation of Ministerial Functions) (No. 4) Order 2006 (S.I. No. 543 of 2006) and having complied with the requirements of Regulation 31 of the European Communities (Natural Habitats) Regulations 1997 (S.I. No. 94 of 1997), hereby make the following bye-law:

1. (1) This Bye-law may be cited as the South Western Fisheries Region (River Sullane) Conservation of Brown Trout Bye-law No. 823, 2007.

(2) This Bye-law comes into operation on the day of its making.

2. This Bye-law applies to the waters of the River Sullane in the No. 5 or Cork District.

3. Subject to Article 4, and notwithstanding anything contained in Bye-law 3 of the Fisheries Bye-laws No. 5 or Cork District No. 341 dated 31 January 1914, it is prohibited for a person to—

(a) take or capture and kill any brown trout of less than 25.5 centimetres in length measured in a straight line from the tip of the snout to the fork of the tail, from the waters to which this Bye-law applies, or

(b) have in possession on or near those waters any such fish so taken or captured.

4. It is prohibited for a person to—

(a) take or capture and kill more than 4 brown trout on any one day in any year from the waters to which this Bye-law applies, or

(b) have in possession on or near those waters more than that amount of brown trout so taken or captured.

5. Any brown trout taken inadvertently in contravention of this Bye-law must be handled carefully and returned without avoidable injury to the waters from which they have been taken.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This is not part of the Bye-law and does not purport to be a legal interpretation.)*

This Bye-law prescribes at 25.5cm the minimum size of brown trout which may be taken in the River Sullane and provided for a daily bag limit of 4 brown trout per angler.

#### FOOTNOTE

Section 11 of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act 1959 provides that any person aggrieved by this Bye-law may within 28 days after its publication in the *Iris Oifigiúil*, appeal against same to the High Court.

No. 30 of 1977) (as adapted by the Marine and Natural Resources (Alteration of Name of Department and Title of Minister) Order 2002 (S.I. No. 307 of 2002)), the Marine (Delegation of Ministerial Functions) Order 2006 (S.I. No. 82 of 2006) and the Marine (Delegation of Ministerial Functions) (No. 4) Order 2006 (S.I. No. 543 of 2006) and having complied with the requirements of Regulation 31 of the European Communities (Natural Habitats) Regulations 1997 (S.I. No. 94 of 1997), hereby make the following bye-law:

1. (1) This Bye-law may be cited as the Shannon Fisheries Region (Angling) Bye-law No. 825, 2007.

(2) This Bye-law comes into operation on the day of its making.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in any bye-law fixing the annual close season, angling from a boat for any kind of fish is prohibited in that section of the Lower River Shannon from Plassy Bridge adjoining the townlands of Sreelane in the county of Clare and Garraun in the county of Limerick to Thomond Bridge in the city of Limerick during the period commencing 1 March and ending on 30 September in any year.

3. The Shannon Fisheries Region (Prohibition on Angling) Bye-law No. C.S. 289, 2007 is revoked.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Bye-Law prohibits angling from a boat for all species of fish during the period 1 March to 30 September in that section of the Lower Shannon as specified in the Bye-law and revokes the Shannon Fisheries Region (Prohibition on Angling) Bye-law No. C.S. 289, 2007.
