SHANNON FISHERIES REGION (RIVER FEALE)

CONSERVATION OF SALMON AND SEA TROUT BYE-
LAW No. 816, 2007

I, John Browne, Minister of State at the Department of Communications, Marine and Natural Resources, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 9 (as amended by section 3 of the Fisheries ((Amendment) Act 1962 (No. 31 of 1962) of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act 1959 (No. 14 of 1959), section 33 for the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1962, the Fisheries (Transfer of Departmental Administration and Ministerial Functions) Order 1977 (S.I. No. 30 of 1977) (as adapted by the Marine and Natural Resources (Alteration of Name of Department and Title of Minister) Order 2002 (S.I. No. 307 of 2002)) and the Marine (Delegation of Ministerial Functions) Order 2006 (S.I. No. 82 of 2006), and having complied with the requirements of Regulation 31 of the European Communities (Natural Habitats) Regulations 1997 (S.I. No. 94 of 1997), hereby make the following bye-law:

1. (1) This Bye-law may be cited as the Shannon Fisheries Region (River Feale) Conservation of Salmon and Sea Trout Bye-law No. 816, 2007.

(2) This Bye-law comes into operation on the day of its making.

2. This Bye-law applies to the waters of the River Feale in the No. 8 or Limerick District.

3. In this Bye-law—

“salmon” means fish of the species *Salmo salar* (Atlantic salmon);

“sea trout” means fish of the migratory form of *Salmo trutta*, but does not include a sea trout which is 40 centimetres or less in length measured in a straight line from the tip of the snout to the fork of the tail;

“specified waters” means the waters to which this Bye-law applies.

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in any bye-law prohibiting the taking or having in possession of more than a specified number of salmon or sea trout, a person shall not take by rod and line in the specified waters more than 10 fish (being either salmon or sea trout or a combination of both) in any year.

5. Notwithstanding Article 4 (a) of the Conservation of Salmon and Sea Trout Bye-law No. 814, 2006 and subject to Article 6, a person shall not take by rod and line in the specified waters—

(a) in the year 2007, during the period from 1 March to 12 May, more than 4 fish, provided that not more than one fish of that amount is taken on any particular day during that period,

or

(b) on any day in any year—

(i) from 13 May to 31 August, more than 3 fish, or

(ii) from 1 September to the end of the season, more than one fish,

being either salmon or sea trout.

6. It is prohibited for a person, in the specified waters, where he or she has taken the number of fish permitted under Article 5, to—

(a) take by rod and line any salmon or sea trout from the waters, unless the fish is handled carefully, not removed from and immediately returned alive, to those waters, or

(b) use or attempt to use any fish hooks, other than single barb less hooks, or worms as bait in angling for salmon or sea trout in the waters.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This is not part of the Bye-law and does not purport to be a legal interpretation).

This Bye-Law provides for a bag limit of 4 fish (being either salmon or sea trout over 40 cm) from 1 March to 12 May subject to a daily bag limit of 1 fish during the period. The Bye-law also incorporates the provisions of the existing Bye-law i.e. an overall annual bag limit of 10 fish for 2007, a daily bag limit of 3 fish from 13 May to 31 August and a daily bag limit of 1 fish from 1 September to the end of the season. The Bye-law also provides for the use of single hooks and prohibits the use of worms as bait once the specified number of fish have been caught in the specified periods.

FOOTNOTE

Section 11 of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act, 1959 provides that any person aggrieved by this Bye-law may within 28 days after its publication in the *Iris Oifigiúil*, appeal against same to the High Court.

CONSERVATION OF SALMON AND TROUT BYE-LAW
NO. 817, 2007.

I, John Browne, Minister of State at the Department of Communications, Marine and Natural Resources, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 9 (as amended by section 3 of the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1962 (No. 31 of 1962)) of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act 1959 (No. 14 of 1959), section 33 of the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1962, the Fisheries (Transfer of Departmental Administration and Ministerial Functions) Order 1977 (S.I. No. 30 of 1977) (as adapted by the Marine and Natural Resources (Alteration of Name of Department and Title of Minister) Order 2002 (S.I. No. 307 of 2002)) and the Marine (Delegation of Ministerial Functions) Order 2006 (S.I. No. 82 of 2006), the Marine (Delegation of Ministerial Functions) (No. 4) Order 2006 (S.I. No. 543 of 2006), and having complied with the requirements of Regulation 31 of the European Communities (Natural Habitats) Regulations 1997 (S.I. No. 94 of 1997), hereby make the following:

1. This Bye-law may be cited as the Shannon Fisheries Region Conservation of Salmon and Trout Bye-law No. 817, 2007.

2. This Bye-law comes into operation on the day of its making.

3. This Bye-law applies to the following waters:

- (a) the River Shannon (including its lakes and tributaries) upstream of Sarsfield Bridge in the city of Limerick, and
- (b) the Rivers Maigue and Fergus and their lakes and tributaries,

in the No. 8 or Limerick District.

4. Subject to Article 5, it is prohibited for any person to take and kill by any means or have in his or her possession any fish of the salmon or trout kind of less than 20 centimetres in length measured in a straight line from the tip of the snout to the fork of the tail, in the waters to which this Bye-law applies.

5. It is prohibited to take and kill by any means or have possession of any fish of the trout kind which is—

- (a) less than 25 centimetres in length measured in a straight line from the tip of the snout to the fork of the tail in the waters of—
 - (i) the tributaries of Lough Derg, or
 - (ii) the River Inny between Lough Sheelin and Lough Derravaragh, and between Lough Derravaragh and Lough Ree,

(b) less than 30 centimetres in length measured in a straight line from the tip of the snout to the fork of the tail in the waters of Loughs Sheelin, Derravaragh, Ennel and Owel, or

(c) less than 35 centimetres in length measured in a straight line from the tip of the snout to the fork of the tail in the waters of Lough Derg south or downstream of the bridge at Portumna in the county of Galway.

6. Notwithstanding anything contained in any bye-law fixing the annual close season, angling for trout with rod and line is prohibited in Lough Derg south or downstream of the bridge at Portumna in the county of Galway during the period 1 October each year and ending on 14 March in the next following year.

7. Any fish taken inadvertently in contravention of Article 4 or 5 must be handled carefully and returned without avoidable injury to the waters from which they have been taken.

8. The following are revoked:

- (a) the Limerick District Bye-law No. 488, 1954,
- (b) the Limerick District Bye-law No. 614, 1980, and
- (c) the Shannon Fisheries Region (Lough Derg) (Conservation of Trout) Bye-law No. 754, 1999.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This is not part of the Bye-law and does not purport to be a legal interpretation).

This Bye-law prescribes the minimum size of trout at 35 cm which may be taken from Lough Derg south or downstream of the bridge at Portumna and prohibits angling for trout during the period 1 October each year to 14 March in the next following year. The Bye-law also provides for a minimum size of trout at 25 cm which may be taken in the waters of the tributaries of Lough Derg and incorporates the provisions of the Limerick District Bye-law Nos. 614, 1980 and 488, 1954.

Section 11 of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act, 1959 provides that any person aggrieved by this Bye-law may within 28 days after its publication in the *Iris Oifigiúil*, appeal against same to the High Court.

(PROHIBITION ON ANGLING WITH ROD AND LINE)

BYE-LAW NO. C.S. 289, 2007

I, John Browne, Minister of State at the Department of Communications, Marine and Natural Resources, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 9 (as amended by section 3 of the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1962 (No. 31 of 1962) of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act 1959 (No. 14 of 1959), section 33 for the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1962, the Fisheries (Transfer of Departmental Administration and Ministerial Functions) Order 1977 (S.I. No. 30 of 1977) (as adapted by the Marine and Natural Resources (Alteration of Name of Department and Title of Minister) Order 2002 (S.I. No. 307 of 2002)) and the Marine (Delegation of Ministerial Functions) Order 2006 (S.I. No. 82 of 2006), and having complied with the requirements of Regulation 31 of the European Communities (Natural Habitats) Regulations 1997 (S.I. No. 94 of 1997), hereby make the following bye-law:

1. (1) This Bye-law may be cited as the Shannon Fisheries Region (Prohibition on Angling) Bye-law No. C.S. 289, 2007.

(2) This Bye-law comes into operation on 1 March 2007.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in any bye-law fixing the annual close season, angling for any kind of fish is prohibited in that section of the Lower River Shannon from Plassy Bridge adjoining the townlands of Sreelane in the county of Clare and Garraun in the county of Limerick to Thomand Bridge in the city of Limerick during the period commencing 1 March and ending on 30 September in any year.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Bye-Law prohibits angling for all species of fish during the period 1 March to 30 September in that section of the Lower Shannon as specified in the Bye-law.
