ASSET COVERED SECURITIES ACT 2001 (SECTION 27(4)) REGULATIONS 2007.

These Regulations designate eligible financial institutions for the purposes of the definition of “credit transaction” in relation to designated mortgage credit institutions. These Regulations come into operation on 31 August, 2007.

ASSET COVERED SECURITIES ACT 2001 (SECTION 42(4)) ORDER 2007.

No. 419 of 2004) by deleting paragraph 3(b) and adding a new paragraph 5 specifying that “prudent market value” under the regulation is to be determined in accordance with any regulatory notice in force under regulation 41 applicable to the type of assets concerned. These Regulations come into operation on 31 August, 2007.

ASSET COVERED SECURITIES ACT 2001 (SECTION 61(1)) REGULATIONS 2007.

These Regulations prescribe as an additional responsibility for the cover-assets monitor appointed under the Asset Covered Securities Act 2001 in respect of a designated mortgage credit institution the monitoring of that institution’s compliance with section 30(13) of the Act. These Regulations come into operation on 31 August, 2007.

These Regulations prescribe that a cover-assets monitor appointed in respect of a designated mortgage credit institution shall, before that institution issues mortgage covered securities, or enters into a cover assets hedge contract, take reasonable steps to verify that the institution will be in compliance with section 32(15) of the Asset Covered Securities Act 2001. These Regulations come into operation on 31 August, 2007.

These Regulations come into operation on 31 August, 2007.
