FISHERIES MANAGEMENT NOTICE No. 001 of 2008
(February Demersal Quota Management Notice)

I, Mary Coughlan, Minister for Agriculture Fisheries and Food (“the Minister”), in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 12 of the Sea-Fisheries and Maritime Jurisdiction Act 2006 (“the Act”), hereby issue the following Notice:

1. This Notice may be cited as Fisheries Management Notice No. 001 of 2008.

2. This Notice comes into force on 1 February 2008.

3. In this Notice:

“CECAF” means the Committee for the Eastern Central Atlantic Fisheries;

“EC waters” means European Community waters. Where this term is used in conjunction with an ICES or CECAF sub-area or division listed in Schedule 1 or Schedule 2 to this Notice, it means that only the European Community waters of that sub-area or division are included for the purposes of this Notice;

“length” means the overall length of a boat, or the distance from the forepart of the stem of the boat to the aft side of the head of the sternpost of the boat or to the foreside of the rudder stock;

“monkfish authorisation” means an authorisation to fish for monkfish (family *Lophiidae*) which has been granted under section 13 of the Act;

“per cent by-catch” means a percentage by live weight of the total quantity of all species of fish, for which the State has an EU fishing quota, that are retained on board or landed on any occasion;

“fishing area” means waters falling within the ICES and CECAF sub-areas and divisions listed in Schedule 1 or Schedule 2 to this Notice as they are defined respectively in Regulation (EEC) No. 3880/91 of 17 December 1991¹, as amended, and Council Regulation (EC) 2597/95 of 23 October 1995², as amended;

“specified period” means the period from 1 February 2008 to 29 February 2008.

4. (a) It is prohibited for an Irish sea-fishing boat greater than or equal to 55 feet in length, or for a person on board that boat, fishing in a fishing area listed in column (2) of Schedule 1 to this Notice, to have or retain on board or land, during the specified period, more of the species of fish given in column (1) of that Schedule opposite that fishing area than the corresponding quantity specified in column (3) of that Schedule if that fish was caught in that fishing area during the specified period.

- (b) It is prohibited for an Irish sea-fishing boat less than 55 feet in length, or for a person on board that boat, fishing in a fishing area listed in column (2) of Schedule 1 to this Notice, to have or retain on board or land, during the specified period, more of the species of fish given in column (1) of that Schedule opposite that fishing area than the corresponding quantity specified in column (4) of that Schedule if that fish was caught in that fishing area during the specified period.
5. (a) It is prohibited for an Irish sea-fishing boat greater than or equal to 55 feet in length to which a 2007 monkfish authorisation has not been granted, or for a person on board that boat, fishing in a fishing area listed in column (2) of Schedule 2 to this Notice, to have or retain on board or land, during the specified period, more of the species of fish given in column (1) of that Schedule opposite that fishing area than the corresponding quantity specified in column (3) of that Schedule if that fish was caught in that fishing area during the specified period.
- (b) It is prohibited for an Irish sea-fishing boat less than 55 feet in length to which a 2008 monkfish authorisation has not been granted, or for a person on board that boat, fishing in a fishing area listed in column (2) of Schedule 2 to this Notice, to have or retain on board or land, during the specified period, more of the species of fish given in column (1) of that Schedule opposite that fishing area than the corresponding quantity specified in column (4) of that Schedule if that fish was caught in that fishing area during the specified period.
- (c) Notwithstanding paragraphs 5(a) and 5(b) of this Notice, it is prohibited for an Irish sea-fishing boat that does not hold a valid monkfish authorisation, or for a person on board that boat, fishing in fishing areas VIIa or VIIb-k, to have or retain on board or land, during the specified period, more haddock than the quantity of haddock specified in column (5) of Schedule 2 to this Notice for that fishing area if that haddock was caught in that fishing area during the specified period.
6. Where a quantity is given in column (3) or column (4) of Schedule 1 or Schedule 2 to this Notice in respect of a particular species of fish, fishing area and type of vessel, and where that quantity is expressed as a per cent by-catch, an Irish sea-fishing boat of that type, or person on board that boat:
- (a) may, notwithstanding paragraphs 5(a) and 5(b) of this Notice, have or retain on board between the hours of 00:01 and 23:59 of each day of a fishing voyage up to 1.5 times that quantity of that species of fish if it was caught in that area during the specified period, but
- (b) must ensure by 24:00 of each day of a fishing voyage that the quantity of that species of fish caught in that area and retained on board does not exceed the per cent by-catch quantity specified in that Schedule for that species and that area and that vessel type.

FISHERIES MANAGEMENT NOTICE No. 002 of 2008
(February Deep-Sea Quota Management Notice)

I, Mary Coughlan, Minister Agriculture Fisheries and Food (“the Minister”), in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 12 of the Sea-Fisheries and Maritime Jurisdiction Act 2006 (“the Act”) hereby issue the following Notice:

1. This Notice may be cited as Fisheries Management Notice No. 002 of 2008.

2. This Notice comes into force on 1 February 2008.

3. In this Notice:

“deep-sea authorisation” means an authorisation to fish for deep-sea species which has been granted under section 13 of the Act;

“deep-sea sharks” means sharks of the following species: *Centroscyrnus coelolepis*, *Centrophorus squamosus*, *Deania calceus*, *Dalatias licha*, *Etmopterus princeps*, *Etmopterus spinax*, *Centrocyllium fabricii*, *Centrophorus granulosus*, *Galeus melastomus*, *Galeus murinus*, *Apristurus spp.*, *Deania histricosa*, and *Deania profundorum*;

“deep-sea species” means the list of deep-sea species given in Annex I of Council Regulation (EC) No. 2347/2002 of 16 December 2002¹;

“length” means the overall length of a boat, or the distance from the forepart of the stem of the boat to the aft side of the head of the sternpost of the boat or to the foreside of the rudder stock;

“per cent by-catch” means a percentage by live weight of the total quantity of all species of fish, for which the State has an EU fishing quota, that are retained on board or landed on any occasion;

“fishing area” means waters falling within the ICES sub-areas and divisions listed in column (2) of Schedule 1 and Schedule 2 to this Notice as they are defined in Regulation (EEC) No. 3880/91 of 17 December 1991², as amended;

“the specified period” means the period from 1 February 2008 to 29 February 2008.

4. (a) It is prohibited for an Irish sea-fishing boat greater than or equal to 55 feet in length, or for a person on board that boat, fishing in a fishing area listed in column (2) of Schedule 1 to this Notice, to have or retain on board or land, during the specified period, more of the species of fish given in column (1) of that Schedule opposite that fishing area than the corresponding quantity specified in column (3) of that Schedule if that fish was caught in that fishing area during the specified period.

(b) It is prohibited for an Irish sea-fishing boat less than 55 feet in length, or for a person on board that boat, fishing in a fishing area listed in column (2) of Schedule 1 to this Notice, to have or retain on board or land, during the specified period, more of the species of fish given in column (1) of that Schedule opposite that fishing area than the corresponding quantity specified in column (4) of that Schedule if that fish was caught in that fishing area during the specified period.

5. (a) It is prohibited for an Irish sea-fishing boat greater than or equal to 55 feet in length to which a 2006 deep-sea authorisation has been granted, or for a person on board that boat, fishing in a fishing area listed in column (2) of Schedule 2 to this Notice, to have or retain on board or land, during the specified period, more of the species of fish given in column (1) of that Schedule opposite that fishing area than the corresponding quantity specified in column (3) of that Schedule if that fish was caught in that fishing area during the specified period.

(b) It is prohibited for an Irish sea-fishing boat less than 55 feet in length to which a 2006 deep-sea authorisation has been granted, or for a person on board that boat, fishing in a fishing area listed in column (2) of Schedule 2 to this Notice, to have or retain on board or land, during the specified period, more of the species of fish given in column (1) of that Schedule opposite that fishing area than the corresponding quantity specified in column (4) of that Schedule if that fish was caught in that fishing area during the specified period.

6. Where a quantity is given in column (3) or column (4) of Schedule 1 or Schedule 2 to this Notice in respect of a particular species of fish, fishing area and type of vessel, and where that quantity is expressed as a per cent by-catch, an Irish sea-fishing boat of that type, or person on board that boat:

(a) may, notwithstanding paragraphs 4(a) and 4(b) of this Notice, have or retain on board, between the hours of 00:01 and 23:59 of each day of a fishing voyage, up to 1.5 times that quantity of that species of fish if it was caught in that area during the specified period, but
