THE FOYLE AREA AND CARLINGFORD AREA
(PROHIBITION OF SALE OF SALMON AND SEA
TROUT CAUGHT BY ROD AND LINE) REGULATIONS
2008.

Made 10th July, 2008

Coming into operation 31st July, 2008

The Foyle, Carlingford and Irish Lights Commission, with the approval of the North/South Ministerial Council, makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by section 13(1) of the Foyle Fisheries Act 1952 (as amended by section 34(3) of the British-Irish Agreement Act 1999) and section 13(1) of the Foyle Fisheries Act (Northern Ireland) 1952 and now vested in it.

Citation and Commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Foyle Area and Carlingford Area (Prohibition of Sale of Salmon and Sea Trout Caught by Rod and Line) Regulations 2008 and shall come into operation on 31st July, 2008.

Interpretation

2. In these Regulations—

“salmon” means a fish of the species *Salmo Salar* (Atlantic Salmon);

“sea trout” means a fish of the migratory form of *Salmo Trutta*.

Prohibition of sale

3. A person shall not sell or offer for sale within the Foyle Area or the Carlingford Area salmon or sea trout caught by rod and line.

These Regulations prohibit the sale of rod and line caught salmon or sea trout within the Foyle Area or the Carlingford Area.

FOYLE AREA (LICENSING OF OYSTER FISHING)
REGULATIONS 2008.

Made 10th July, 2008

Coming into operation 31st July, 2008

The Foyle, Carlingford and Irish Lights Commission, with the approval of the North/South Ministerial Council, makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by section 13(1) and (2) of the Foyle Fisheries Act 1952 and section 13(1) and (2) of the Foyle Fisheries Act (Northern Ireland) 1952 and now vested in it.

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Foyle Area (Licensing of Oyster Fishing) Regulations 2008 and shall come into operation on 31st July 2008.

Exception

2. These Regulations do not apply to any person who is operating under the authority of, and in accordance with, an aquaculture licence granted under section 52A of the Foyle Fisheries Act (Northern Ireland) 1952 or section 53A of the Foyle Fisheries Act 1952.

Interpretation

3. In these Regulations—

“dredge” means a towed device used for the collection of molluscs from the seabed;

“Lough Foyle” means those waters in the Foyle Area bounded on the north or seaward side by an imaginary straight line drawn between Greencastle Fort in the County of Donegal and the Martello Tower at Magilligan Point in the County of Londonderry and bounded on the south by the defined mouth of the River Foyle;

“oyster” means a bivalve mollusc of the species *Ostrea Edulis*;

“oyster fishing licence” means a licence issued pursuant to Regulation 7.

Licensing of oyster fishing

4.—(1) A person shall not use a dredge in any part of the Foyle Area for the purpose of taking oysters or with intent to take oysters except under and in accordance with an oyster fishing licence issued by the Commission.

(2) The Commission may issue an oyster fishing licence subject to such conditions or limitations as it considers appropriate.

Applications for oyster fishing licences

5.—(1) An application for an oyster fishing licence shall be made in writing in such form as the Commission may from time to time require and shall be accompanied by a valid—

(a) licence to fish issued by virtue of the Sea Fish (Conservation) Act 1967^(a); or

(b) Sea Fishing Boat Licence as required in accordance with the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 2003 as inserted by the Sea Fisheries and Maritime Jurisdiction Act 2006^(b).

^(b) Legislation of the Republic of Ireland.

(2) An application for an oyster fishing licence shall be received by the Commission no later than 31st July in the year in which the oyster fishing licence commences.

(3) An oyster fishing licence shall not be issued unless the application has been approved by the Commission and no applicant shall receive in any year more than one oyster fishing licence.

(4) Where an application has been approved under paragraph (3) an officer authorised by the Commission in that behalf shall endorse the approval on the application and shall return it to the applicant.


Payment of oyster fishing licence fee

6.—(1) The fishing licence fee specified in the Schedule shall be paid in the manner set out in paragraph (2).

(2) Where an application has been endorsed under Regulation 5(4), it may be presented by the applicant to the Commission and the whole amount of the oyster fishing licence fee shall be paid at the time of presentation.

Issue of oyster fishing licences

7. On presentation of an application endorsed under Regulation 5(4) and payment of the fee specified in the Schedule, the Commission shall issue the licence to the applicant and retain the endorsed application.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations prohibit the dredging for oysters in the Foyle Area without a valid oyster fishing licence and prescribe the application procedure and fee for such licence.

THE FOYLE AREA (CONTROL OF OYSTER FISHING) REGULATIONS 2008.

Made 10th July, 2008

Coming into operation 31st July, 2008

The Foyle, Carlingford and Irish Lights Commission, with the approval of the North/South Ministerial Council, makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by section 13(1) of the Foyle Fisheries Act 1952 and section 13(1) of the Foyle Fisheries Act (Northern Ireland) 1952 and now vested in it.

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Foyle Area (Control of Oyster Fishing) Regulations 2008 and shall come into operation on 31st July, 2008.

Interpretation

2. In these Regulations—

“the defined mouth” in relation to any river means the mouth of that river as defined by regulations made under the Foyle Fisheries Act 1952 and the Foyle Fisheries Act (Northern Ireland) 1952;

“dredge” means a towed device used for the collection of molluscs from the seabed;

“oyster” means a bivalve mollusc of the species *Ostrea Edulis*;

“oyster fishing licence” means a licence issued in accordance with the Foyle Area (Licensing of Oyster Fishing) Regulations 2008;

“Lough Foyle” means those waters in the Foyle Area bounded on the north or seaward side by an imaginary straight line drawn between Greencastle Fort in the County of Donegal and the Martello Tower at Magilligan Point in the County of Londonderry and bounded on the south by the defined mouth of the River Foyle;

“the River Foyle” means all of the River Foyle upstream of the defined mouth of the River Foyle;

“seaward of Lough Foyle” means those waters in the Foyle Area which lie seawards of an imaginary straight line drawn between Greencastle Fort in the County of Donegal and the Martello Tower at Magilligan Point in the County of Londonderry and of the defined mouth of the Culdaff River.

Exception

3. These Regulations do not apply to any person who is operating under the authority of, and in accordance with, an aquaculture licence granted under section 52A of the Foyle Fisheries Act (Northern Ireland) 1952 or section 53A of the Foyle Fisheries Act 1952.

Restriction on oyster fishing

4. A person shall not use for the purpose of taking or with intent to take oysters any dredge in any area within the Foyle Area—

(1) Which is within any area specified in an aquaculture licence granted under section 52A of the Foyle Fisheries Act (Northern Ireland) 1952 or section 53A of the Foyle Fisheries Act 1952; or

(2) During any period of suspension declared in relation to that area under Regulation 9.

Control of oyster fishing in the Foyle Area

5.—(1) No dredge with a blade width exceeding 2 metres shall be used for the purpose of taking or with intent to take oysters.

(2) No more than two dredges with an aggregate blade width exceeding 4 metres shall be carried on any vessel for the purpose of taking or with intent to take oysters with the exception of a fishing boat proceeding to or from waters upstream of the defined mouth of the River Foyle or seaward of Lough Foyle.

(3) No dredge shall be used for the purpose of taking or with intent to take oysters on any day between 18.00 hours and 06.00 hours.

(4) No dredge shall be used for the purpose of taking or with intent to take oysters during the period beginning at 18.00 hours on any Friday and ending at 06.00 hours on the next following Monday.

(5) No dredge shall be used for the purpose of taking or with intent to take oysters during the period beginning on 1st April and ending on 18th September next following (both dates inclusive).

Restriction on size

6. No person shall retain on board a vessel, within the Foyle Area, any oysters which will pass through a circular ring of 75mm in internal diameter.

Return of oysters

7. Any person who takes any oyster, the retention of which on board a vessel is prohibited under Regulation 6, shall immediately return it, without avoidable injury, as near as possible to the place from which it was taken.

Numbering of vessels

8.—(1) A person shall not use a vessel for the purpose of oyster fishing in any part of the Foyle Area unless the requirements set out in paragraph (2) are met.

(2) The requirements are—

(a) the number of the oyster fishing licence in which the vessel is named shall be displayed with distinct figures on each side of the bow and no vessel shall have displayed on its bow more than one such licence number;

(b) such figures shall be not less than 15 centimetres in height and not less than 2.5 centimetres in breadth;

(c) such figures shall be displayed in white on a black background using materials capable of withstanding the marine environment; and

(d) such figures shall not be effaced, covered or obscured in any manner whatsoever.

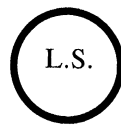
Suspension of fishing

9.—(1) If the Commission is satisfied that it is necessary or expedient for the conservation and protection of oysters it may declare fishing for oysters in any part of the Foyle Area suspended for such period as may be specified in the declaration.

(2) A declaration made under paragraph (1) shall be made by certificate under the hand of the Chief Executive or such other officer of the Commission authorised by the Chief Executive for that purpose and shall be published in one or more newspapers circulating in the Foyle Area.

(3) A declaration made under paragraph (1) shall give the reasons for the declaration.

(4) Any period of suspension declared under paragraph (1) shall not take effect until 48 hours after the publication of the declaration.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations provide for the control of oyster fishing within the Foyle Area.

They provide for the introduction of size limit of oysters that may be retained. They also provide for a daily fishing period, weekly fishing periods and annual close season for the taking of wild oysters, and prohibit the fishing of oysters in areas specified in aquaculture licences granted by the Commission.

These Regulations also provide for a vessel named in an oyster fishing licence to display a licence number and allow the Foyle, Carlingford and Irish Lights Commission to declare a period of suspension of oyster fishing in order to conserve and protect.

(3) Any oysters retained on board a vessel shall be placed in a bag and the bag shall be tagged in accordance with paragraph (2) as soon as practicable, but before the bag is removed from the vessel from which the oysters were caught.

(4) Each tag shall—

- (a) have the current fishing period marked on it;
- (b) have the letters “LA” marked on it;
- (c) bear a tag number issued under these Regulations to the holder of the oyster fishing licence;
- (d) not be damaged or altered in any respect;
- (e) not be effaced, covered or obscured in any manner whatsoever.

Issue of identification tags to licence holders

5. Any person holding an oyster fishing licence shall be issued by the Commission with a sufficient number of tags to enable him to comply with these Regulations.

Prohibitions

6.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), a person shall not—

- (a) remove a tag that is affixed to a bag;
- (b) sell, offer or expose for sale, export or tranship at sea any oyster that is not placed in a bag with a tag affixed to it;
- (c) have in his possession any oyster which has been caught and retained, whether by him or another person, other than in accordance with Regulation 4;
- (d) forge or alter any tag or cause or permit any tag to be forged or altered;
- (e) knowingly give false information to obtain a tag;
- (f) transfer or sell a tag.

(2) Regulation 6(1)(a) shall not apply to any person who is preparing oysters for sale and is required to grade, pack or process such oysters, provided that the tag was removed at the time of grading, packing or processing.

Issue of logbooks

7.—(1) The Commission shall issue an oyster fishing logbook to the holder of an oyster fishing licence.

(2) An oyster fishing logbook shall relate to one oyster fishing licence only.

Maintenance and return of logbooks

8.—(1) The holder of a logbook shall have the logbook in his possession when fishing for oysters under the licence to which the logbook relates.

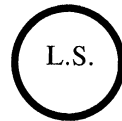
(2) The holder of a logbook shall produce the logbook for examination upon request by an authorised officer.

(3) Where a person fishes for oysters (whether or not any oysters are taken) he shall make an appropriate entry in the logbook and such entry shall be made by the holder of the logbook before midnight on the day in which the fishing for oysters occurred.

(4) Every holder of a logbook shall, not later than 3 days after the expiration of every week which or part of which is in the fishing period of such year, make to the Commission a return in the form set out in the Schedule.

(5) The holder of the logbook shall report any loss, or destruction of the logbook as soon as possible to the Commission.

(6) Where the Commission issued a logbook and is satisfied that it has been lost or destroyed, the Commission shall replace it.

These Regulations—

- (a) require every person using a dredge for the taking of oysters (*Ostrea Edulis*) to affix a tag to every oyster bag retained (Regulation 4);
- (b) provide for the issue of tags to such persons (Regulation 5);
- (c) provide for the removal of a tag which is affixed to an oyster bag only in specified circumstances (Regulation 6);
- (d) prohibit the sale, export or transshipment at sea of any oysters (*Ostrea Edulis*) that have not been placed in a bag and a tag affixed to the bag (Regulation 6);
- (e) prohibit the forging or alteration of tags (Regulation 6);
- (f) prohibit the giving of false information to obtain a tag (Regulation 6);
- (g) provide for the keeping of logbooks and the issue and return of such logbooks (Regulations 7 and 8).
