VALUE-ADDED TAX (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 2009.

The Revenue Commissioners have made Regulations under the Value-Added Tax Act 1972 concerning the operation of VAT. These Regulations insert a new Regulation 33A into the Value-Added Tax Regulations 2006 (S.I. No. 548 of 2006) in relation to the travel agent's margin scheme. The scheme provides for the taxation, from 1 January 2010, of margin scheme services supplied by *tour operators and travel agents, acting as principals* (referred to in the VAT Directive as "travel agents").

MERCHANT SHIPPING (LIGHT DUES) ORDER 2009.

This Order revokes and replaces the Merchant Shipping (Light Dues) Order 2006. It increases the level of light dues levied on Merchant Shipping collected from vessels calling to ports within the State from 52 to 57 cents per ton from 1 August, 2009.

In addition, from 1 August, 2009, the Order increases the maximum number of voyages for which dues may be levied from 7 to 9 voyages in any one year.

SALMON AND TROUT CONSERVATION

SALMON AND TROUT CONSERVATION (EXTENSION
TO DRAFT NETS SEASON) BYE-LAW No. 859, 2009.

I, Eamon Ryan, Minister for Communications, Energy and Natural Resources, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 9 (as amended by section 3 of the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1962 (No. 31 of 1962)) of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act 1959 (No. 14 of 1959), section 33 (as amended by section 6(2) of the Fisheries Act 1980 (No. 1 of 1980)) of the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1962, the Fisheries (Transfer of Departmental Administration and Ministerial Functions) Order 1977 (S.I. No. 30 of 1977) (as adapted by the Communications, Marine and Natural Resources (Alteration of Name of Department and Title of Minister) Order 2007 (S.I. No. 706 of 2007)) and having complied with the requirements of Regulation 31 of the European Communities (Natural Habitats) Regulations 1997 (S.I. No. 94 of 1997), hereby make the following bye-law:

1. (1) This Bye-law may be cited as the Salmon and Trout Conservation (Extension to Draft Nets Season) Bye-law No. 859, 2009.

(2) This Bye-law comes into operation on 1 August 2009.

2. Notwithstanding Article 3 of the Salmon and Trout Conservation (Draft Nets and Snap Nets) Bye-law No. 856, 2009 or anything contained in any Bye-law fixing the annual close season for salmon or trout in any locality, the annual close season for the taking of salmon or trout using a draft net in the year 2009 commences on 15 August in the waters of the rivers mentioned in column (2) opposite mention of a fishery district in column (1) of the Schedule.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This note is not part of the Bye-law and does not purport to be a legal interpretation).

This Bye-Law sets out the annual close season for the draft net salmon and trout (salmon includes sea trout as defined in the Fisheries Consolidation Act 1959) commercial fishing season in the rivers mentioned in the schedule to the Bye-law.

FOOTNOTE

Section 11 of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act 1959 provides that any person aggrieved by this Bye-law may within 28 days after its publication in the *Iris Oifigiúil*, appeal against same to the High Court.
