**INFECTIOUS DISEASES MAINTENANCE ALLOWANCE
(INCREASED PAYMENT) REGULATIONS 2008.**

The effect of these Regulations is to increase, in respect of the week commencing 1st December, 2008, the maximum weekly rate of maintenance allowance payable under Section 44 of the Health Act 1947 by a sum equal to one hundred per cent of that amount or €30.00, whichever is the greater.
