## SALMON AND TROUT CONSERVATION

SALMON AND TROUT CONSERVATION (DRAFT NETS  
AND SNAP NETS) BYE-LAW NO. 856, 2009.

I, Eamon Ryan, Minister for Communications, Energy and Natural Resources, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 9 (as amended by section 3 of the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1962 (No. 31 of 1962)) of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act 1959 (No. 14 of 1959), section 33 (as amended by section 6(2) of the Fisheries Act 1980 (No. 1 of 1980)) of the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1962, the Fisheries (Transfer of Departmental Administration and Ministerial Functions) Order 1977 (S.I. No. 30 of 1977) (as adapted by the Communications, Marine and Natural Resources (Alteration of Name of Department and Title of Minister) Order 2007 (S.I. No. 706 of 2007)) and having complied with the requirements of Regulation 31 of the European Communities (Natural Habitats) Regulations 1997 (S.I. No. 94 of 1997), hereby make the following bye-law:

1. (1) This Bye-law may be cited as the Salmon and Trout Conservation (Draft Nets and Snap Nets) Bye-law No. 856, 2009.

(2) This Bye-law comes into operation on 12 May 2009.

2. In this Bye-law—

“draft net” means a single wall of netting attached to a floating head rope and a weighted ground rope, designed so that a bag is formed into which the catch is drafted or hauled, for the purpose of fishing;

“snap net” means a single wall of netting attached to a floating head rope and a weighted ground rope, designed to suspend between two boats and into which the catch is drawn, for the purpose of taking or fishing for, or attempting to take or to fish for, salmon or trout;

“monofilament” means a single filament of synthetic material having a diameter equal to or greater than 0.1 millimetres and which is strong enough to function alone as a yarn for the construction of nets without having to undergo any further processing;

“multistrand monofilament” means filaments of synthetic material, comprised of two or more monofilaments twisted together, where any single filament has a diameter equal to or greater than 0.1 millimetres;

“Cork Harbour” means that part of the sea in a straight line drawn in the direction of Kilcolta Church from the Lighthouse at Roche’s Point on the east to the mainland on the west as defined and marked out on 8 February 1864 by the Special Commissioners for Irish Fisheries appointed and acting under the Salmon Fishery (Ireland) Act 1863.

3. Subject to this Bye-law, it is prohibited to take or to fish for, or to attempt to take or to fish for, salmon or trout with a

draft net or snap net or to aid or assist in such taking, fishing, or attempting—

- (a) in any fishery district, other than the waters of those rivers mentioned in column (2) opposite mention of a fishery district in column (1) of Parts 1 and 2 of the Schedule, and
- (b) during the period commencing on 12 May 2009 and ending on 2 August 2009, in the waters of the rivers mentioned in column (2) opposite mention of a fishery district in column (1) of Part 2 of the Schedule.

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in any bye-law varying the weekly close time, it is prohibited to take or to fish for, or to attempt to take or to fish for, salmon or trout or to aid or assist in such taking, fishing, or attempting in any fishery district—

- (a) with a draft net, during the period commencing at 6 o'clock a.m. on any Monday and ending at 6 o'clock a.m. on the next following Tuesday, other than during the month of July in the year 2009, or
- (b) with a snap net, during the period commencing at 6 o'clock a.m. on any Saturday and ending at 6 o'clock a.m. on the next following Monday.

5. Notwithstanding anything contained in any bye-law fixing the annual close season for salmon or trout in any locality, it is prohibited to take or to fish for, or to attempt to take or to fish for, salmon or trout, or to aid or assist in such taking, fishing or attempting in any fishery district—

- (a) with a draft net, during the period commencing on 1 August 2009 and ending on 11 May, 2010, or
- (b) with a snap net, during the period commencing on 15 August, 2009 and ending on 11 May 2010.

6. It is prohibited—

- (a) to have on board any boat,
- (b) to have in or on any vehicle, or
- (c) on or near the banks of a river or the shore of its estuary,

with the intention of taking or fishing for, or attempting to take or to fish for, salmon or trout, a draft net or snap net in a fishery district, during any of the periods applicable to those nets specified in Articles 4 and 5.

7. (1) Subject to paragraph (2) and notwithstanding anything contained in any bye-law regulating the net to be used in fishing for salmon or trout, it is prohibited to use, or to attempt to use, in fishing for salmon or trout in any fishery district a draft net made wholly or partly of monofilament or multistrand monofilament.

(2) Paragraph (1) in so far as it applies to draft net fishing for salmon or trout, or attempting to use a draft net in fishing for salmon or trout made wholly or partly of monofilament or

multistrand monofilament does not apply to such fishing in Cork Harbour.

(3) Subject to paragraph (4), it is prohibited to have on board any boat, or to have in possession, for the capture of salmon or trout, on any quay on or adjacent to, or on or near any bank of, any waters in any fishery district, a draft net mounted or otherwise prepared for use in fishing for salmon or trout, made wholly or partly of monofilament or multistrand monofilament.

(4) Paragraph (3) in so far as it applies to having on board any boat, or having in possession, for the capture of salmon or trout, a draft net, mounted or otherwise prepared for use in fishing for salmon or trout, made wholly or partly of monofilament or multistrand monofilament does not apply in Cork Harbour.

8. The Salmon and Trout Conservation Bye-law No. 837, 2008 is revoked.

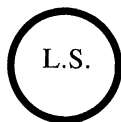

## EXPLANATORY NOTE.

*(This note is not part of the Bye-law and does not purport to be a legal interpretation).*

This Bye-Law sets out the opening and closing dates (and hours) for the draft net and snap net salmon and trout (salmon includes sea trout as defined in the Fisheries Consolidation Act 1959) commercial fishing season and prohibits draft net and snap net fishing for (salmon and trout) in all districts other than those rivers mentioned in the schedule. The Bye Law also prohibits the use of monofilament material in draft nets with the exception of Cork Harbour where monofilament material in draft nets is permitted.

## FOOTNOTE

Section 11 of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act, 1959 provides that any person aggrieved by this Bye-law may within 28 days after its publication in the *Iris Oifigiúil*, appeal against same to the High Court.

## SALMON AND TROUT CONSERVATION

SALMON AND TROUT CONSERVATION  
(PROHIBITION ON USE OF DRIFT NETS AND OTHER  
ENGINES) BYE-LAW NO. 857, 2009.

I, Eamon Ryan, Minister for Communications, Energy and Natural Resources, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 9 (as amended by section 3 of the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1962 (No. 31 of 1962)) of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act 1959 (No. 14 of 1959), section 33 (as amended by section 6(2) of the Fisheries Act 1980 (No. 1 of 1980)) of the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1962, the Fisheries (Transfer of Departmental Administration and Ministerial Functions) Order 1977 (S.I. No. 30 of 1977) (as adapted by the Communications, Marine and Natural Resources (Alteration of Name of Department and Title of Minister) Order 2007 (S.I. No. 706 of 2007)) and having complied with the requirements of Regulation 31 of the European Communities (Natural Habitats) Regulations 1997 (S.I. No. 94 of 1997), hereby make the following bye-law:

1. (1) This Bye-law may be cited as the Salmon and Trout Conservation (Prohibition on Use of Drift Nets and Other Engines) Bye-law No. 857, 2009.

(2) This Bye-law comes into operation on 12 May 2009.

2. In this Bye-law—

“drift net” means a single sheet of netting attached to a floating head rope and a weighted ground rope, designed to drift freely at the surface of waters for the purpose of fishing to which net or ropes no weights or anchoring devices are attached which in any way hinder or prevent the free movement of the net in those waters;

“other engine” means any fishing engine not being a drift net, a draft net, a snap net, box, or a rod and line, capable of being used for the purpose of fishing for salmon or sea trout.

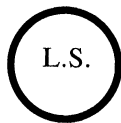
3. Notwithstanding anything contained in any bye-law fixing the annual close season for salmon or trout in any locality, it is prohibited to take or to fish for, or to attempt to take or to fish for, salmon or trout with a drift net or other engine, or to aid or assist in such taking, fishing or attempting in any fishery district in any year.

4. It is prohibited—

- (a) to have on board any boat,
- (b) to have in or on any vehicle, or
- (c) on or near the banks of a river or the shore of its estuary,

with the intention of taking or fishing for, or attempting to take or to fish for, salmon or trout, a drift net or other engine in any fishery district in any year.

5. The Salmon and Trout Conservation (Drift Nets, Snap Nets and Other Engines) Bye-law No. 836, 2008 is revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

*(This note is not part of the Bye-law and does not purport to be a legal interpretation).*

This Bye-Law prohibits Drift Net and other engine fishing for salmon and trout (salmon includes sea trout as defined in the Fisheries Consolidation Act 1959) in all fishery districts. The Bye Law also prohibits having on board a boat, a vehicle or on or near the banks of a river or the shore of its estuary these nets with the intention of fishing for salmon or trout.

FOOTNOTE

Section 11 of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act, 1959 provides that any person aggrieved by this Bye-law may within 28 days after its publication in the *Iris Oifigiúil*, appeal against same to the High Court.

REGULATION AND CONTROL OF CERTAIN  
MARITIME CRAFT BYE-LAWS 2009

Donegal County Council as local authority for the administrative County of Donegal in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 6 of the Maritime Safety Act 2005 hereby makes the following bye-laws for the regulation and control of certain maritime craft in the waters hereinafter described which are part of its functional area.

1. TITLE—

These bye-laws shall be known as the Donegal County Council (Regulation and Control of certain Maritime Craft) Bye-Laws 2009.

2. COMMENCEMENT—

These bye-laws shall come into operation on the 1st day of May 2009.

3. INTERPRETATION—

In these bye-laws:—

- (i) Words and phrases defined in the Act shall have the same meaning in these bye-laws unless otherwise specified.
- (ii) “Act” means the Maritime Safety Act 2005.
- (iii) “Council” means Donegal County Council.
- (iv) “Recreational craft” shall be as defined in the Act but subject to the qualification that such craft as are used at the relevant time for lawful fishing purposes are excluded.
- (v) “Scheduled waters” means the Schedule A, B and C waters together.
- (vi) “Schedule A waters” means the waters specified in the Schedule A hereto.
- (vii) “Schedule B waters” means the waters specified in the Schedule B hereto.
- (viii) “Schedule C waters” means the waters specified in the Schedule C hereto.

4. GENERAL—

- (i) In the interests of the safety of persons using the scheduled waters and/or to prevent nuisance to or injury to persons or damage to watercraft or other property on those waters and subject to sub-paragraph (vi) hereof, the operation of—
  - (a) personal watercraft and recreational craft are prohibited in the Schedule A waters and
  - (b) personal watercraft are prohibited in the Schedule B waters

- (ii) No personal watercraft or recreational craft shall be launched into, moored or berthed in the Schedule A waters.
- (iii) No personal watercraft shall be launched into, moored or berthed in the Schedule B waters
- (iv) In the Schedule B waters recreational craft shall be operated at a speed not exceeding 5 knots for a distance of 100 metres from any launch or landing site.
- (v) In the Schedule C waters recreational craft and personal watercraft shall be operated at a speed not exceeding 5 knots for a distance of 100 metres from any launch or landing site.
- (vi) In addition to the categories of craft described in Section 18 of the Act these Bye-Laws will also not apply to craft operated by a recognised Water Safety Association or other body for the purpose of training persons in the operation of craft or general water safety or providing other bona fide water safety services, which body is approved in writing in advance by the Council either generally or in connection with an event held on specified date(s) on the scheduled waters or any specified part thereof.

#### LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 2001 — SECTION 202

REGULATION AND CONTROL OF CERTAIN BEACHES  
BYE-LAWS 2009

Donegal County Council as local authority for its functional area (being the entire County excluding the towns of Bundoran, Ballyshannon, Letterkenny and Bunrana therein) in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 199 (1) of the Local Government Act 2001 hereby makes the following bye-laws for the regulation and control of certain beaches hereinafter described which are situate within its functional area.

1. TITLE —

These bye-laws shall be known as the Donegal County Council (Regulation and Control of certain Beaches) Bye-Laws 2009.

2. COMMENCEMENT —

These bye-laws shall come into operation on the 1st day of May 2009.

3. INTERPRETATION —

In these bye-laws:—

- (i) Words and phrases defined in the Act shall have the same meaning in these bye-laws unless otherwise specified.
- (ii) “Act” means the Local Government Act 2001.
- (iii) “Authorised person” has the same meaning as in Section 204 of the Act.
- (iv) “Beach” means and includes the entire area (whether made up of beach, dunes or other ground) specified for each beach in the Schedule hereto and refers to any one of the beaches so specified where the context admits or requires.
- (v) “Beaches” means collectively those specified in the Schedule hereto.
- (vi) “Council” means Donegal County Council.
- (vii) “Mechanically propelled vehicle” has the same meaning as in the Road Traffic Act 1961 (as amended) but excluding such vehicles as are used in the course of duty by the Council, the Garda Síochána, the Defence Forces, the Revenue Commissioners, the Central Fisheries Board, the Northern Regional Fisheries Board, the Foyle, Carlingford and Irish Lights Commission, the Irish Coastguard, the Royal National Lifeboat Institution and any other such vehicles involved in bona fide law enforcement, emergency or rescue missions.
- (viii) “Temporary dwelling” means a caravan, camper van, tent or other object used for the purpose of caravanning, camping or habitation.

4. MOTOR VEHICLES

- (a) Subject to paragraph (b) below, no person shall drive or attempt to drive a mechanically propelled vehicle onto or along the beaches.
- (b) Notwithstanding (a) above persons may drive onto and along and park on the beaches numbered 3 and 11 in the Schedule hereto save in the sections thereof (if any at the particular time) that are designated as “Car free areas”.

5. CAMPING/OVERNIGHT PARKING

No person shall bring onto, place, erect or keep a temporary dwelling on a beach without the prior permission in writing of the Council, and subject to the terms and conditions of any such permission.

6. CONTROL OF HORSES

During the months of June, July and August each year a person shall not ride or bring a horse/pony on to a beach between the hours of 11.00 a.m. and 7.00 p.m. without having obtained a license in advance from the Council and in that event will comply with the conditions of that licence.

7. CONTROL OF DOGS

During the months of June, July and August of each year persons in charge of a dog on a beach are required to keep such dog on a leash of fixed length of less than 2 metres.

8. GENERAL

No person shall —

- (a) Cause damage to the dune system on a beach and in that regard should take due care when walking in the dune areas.
- (b) Take part in archery, golf, paint balling or any other game/sport involving high speed projectiles on a beach.
- (c) Sell, offer or expose for sale any vehicle or other article whatsoever on a beach unless a Licence for such activity is obtained in advance from the Council and it is carried out in accordance with the conditions thereof.
- (d) Offer for monetary reward, tuition in surfing or any other watersports activity from a beach unless a license is obtained in advance from the Council and the activity is conducted in accordance with the conditions of such licence.

9. FIXED PAYMENT NOTICES

- (a) The Council may as an alternative to prosecution serve on a person alleged to have contravened any of these bye-laws, a notice specifying a fixed payment to be made in respect of such contravention.
- (b) The amount of the fixed payment will be €75.00 being the amount currently prescribed by the Minister for the purposes of Section 206(1) of the Act or such

different amount as may so prescribed at the date of the alleged contravention.

- (c) The said amount shall be paid within a period of four weeks from the date of service of the said notice.
