KILKENNY COUNTY COUNCIL

ROAD TRAFFIC SPECIAL SPEED LIMIT BYE-LAWS 2012

In accordance with Section 9 of the Road Traffic Act 2004, and in the interests of road safety, Kilkenny County Council has made Special Speed Limit Bye-Laws, effective from 23rd March, 2012, in respect of various towns and villages throughout County Kilkenny.

The Bye-Laws are necessary as a consequence of the growth of the towns and villages involved. The purpose of the Bye-Laws is to provide special speed limits of 100km/h, 80km/h, 60km/h, 50km/h and 30km/h on the sections of roads specified in the Third to Eighth Schedule of the Bye-Laws in the interest of prudent traffic management and road safety. This review follows on from other recent reviews which included:

- the introduction of the school safety programme.
- new road schedule classifications on foot of M8, M9 and N25.
- 100kph special speed limit on part of the Regional Road Network.
- 30kph special speed limit in Kilkenny City.

The proposed Bye-Laws include the following amendments to the previously adopted special speed limit Bye-Laws:

- introduction of a new 50kph speed limit zone in Tullahought and Castlewarren.
- special speed limit of 80kph at Granagh to Newrath Roundabout, from Newrath Roundabout to Sallypark and to the junction with the Old New Ross Road at Slieverue.
- extensions to the existing 30kph, 50kph and/or 60kph zones at Tullaroan, Windgap, The Rower, Paulstown, Gowran, Graiguenamanagh and Thomastown.
- special periodic speed limit of 60kph at Kells Road (Evergreen) regularising entrance provisions at this location.
- various Bye-Law terminology revisions on foot of legal experience in the period since the last Bye-Law review.

Concerning European Commission Decision 2012/53/EU relating to the Prohibition on the Placing of Certain Cigarette Lighters on the Market.

The European Commission Decision 2012/53/EU prolongs the validity of Decision 2006/502/EC, concerning the prohibition and sale of certain cigarette lighters, until 11 May, 2013.

Decision 2006/502/EC, amended by Decision 2012/53/EU, requires Member States to take measures to:

- ensure that all non-refillable lighters placed on the market are child-resistant.
- prohibit the placing on the market of novelty and child appealing lighters.

The Commission Decision, under Article 13 of Directive 2001/95/EC General Product Safety Directive was taken on the 27 January, 2012 and published in the Official Journal of the European Union on 31 January, 2012 — L 27 Page 24.

The National Consumer Agency is responsible for implementing the Commission Decision in Ireland. The National Consumer Agency is empowered to issue a direction to any operator found not to be complying with the Commission Decision. Any person who fails to comply with such a direction may be guilty of an offence and liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding €3,000 and/or imprisonment for 3 months.

NOTICE TO MANUFACTURERS, IMPORTERS,

Concerning the decision by the European Commission to prohibit the availability of products containing the biocide dimethylfumarate (DMF) on the market.

The European Commission Decision 2012/48/EU of 26 January, 2012, prolongs the validity of Decision 2009/251/EC requiring Member States to ensure that products containing the biocide dimethylfumarate (DMF) are not placed or made available on the market. Decision 2012/48/EU was published in the Official Journal of the European Union on 28 January, 2012 and shall apply until entry into force of the Commission Regulation amending Annex XVII to Regulation (EC) No. 1907/2006 concerning DMF or 15th March, 2013, whichever is the earlier.

In accordance with the Commission's Decision 2009/251/EC of 17 March, 2009, Member States are required to:

- ensure that products containing DMF are prohibited from being placed or made available on the market, and
- ensure that products containing DMF and already placed on the market are withdrawn from the market and recalled from consumers, and that consumers are adequately informed of the risk posed by such products.

The Commission's Decision, under Article 13 of Directive 2001/95/EC General Product Safety Directive was taken on 17 March, 2009 and published in the Official Journal on 20 March, 2009.

The National Consumer Agency, as the competent authority, will implement the Commission's Decision. The National Consumer Agency is empowered to issue a direction to any operator found not to be complying with the Commission's Decision. Any person who fails to comply with such a direction would be guilty of an offence and would be liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding €3,000 and/or imprisonment for 3 months.
